MORE APPLES CAN BE EASILY SOLD

Over-production of marketable apples in Oregon will never be a contingency to reckon with, according to H. M. Williamson, secretary of the State Board of Horticulture, in the course of his address given recently at the Portland Y. M. C. A.

Mr. Williamson said there is no ground for the fears of some that the people of this state are planting too large an acreage of apples. He said that the foreign market for apples raised in this state and other Pacific Coast states is growing in large proportions annually, and is bound to increase rapidly. He was of the opinion that with the completion and operation of the Panama Canal, the market for apples in this section of the United States will be world wide in extent.

"We should not expect to get fancy prices for our apples, such as we have obtained in the past," said Mr. Williamson. "Apples at \$2 a box are too high, and, of course, the demand will be limited as long as the price is that high."

"Our market in the future must be created among the middle class. We must, therefore, be content to sell our products at a price that will be attractive to the masses, and expect us reasonably fair returns. People who earn from \$1000 to \$1500 a year will be the ones who will buy our apples. They constitute the masses both in this country and Europe. I am positive we can raise apples in Oregon to supply that class of people, and the returns will be such as to make apple-raising still the most profitable industry in Oregon."

"Within the next few years, Continental Europe and the English possessions will take all the apples we can ship, provided we are satisfied to accept reasonable prices for the products."

Mr. Williamson said it was a mistake to believe that Spitzburgs and Yellow Newtowns Pippins were the only two commercial varieties that should be raised. He said that certain varieties grew to better advantage in different districts and that each fruit growing district should make a specialty of the kinds which do the best there. For instance, the Northern Spy, does well in the Willamette Valley, and fails to reach the same standard east of the Cascade Mountains. On the other hand, the Winter Banana, raised at a high altitude and in a dry climate, such as in the district above The Dalles, gives better satisfaction than if raised on the west side of the Cascades.

The speaker was of the opinion that yellow apples were better adapted to the Willamette Valley than red apples. Colored apples, he said, reached the greatest degree of perfection where there were longer periods of sunshine throughout the growing season.

Mr. Williamson's remarks were more particularly directed to the Oregon apple men in general and will not hold wholly true for each section of the state. In Hood River the price for the best apples will never go much below \$2 a box if the growers will adhere strictly to the high standards of grading and packing which they have set themselves and the world. Whenever they neglect these things the prices will take a bad slump. Hood River apples can always be sold to the high class trade which is willing to pay a premium for an extra fancy product. If the growers keep up their own pace already set, Spitzburg and Newtowns are the apples which do better in Hood River than any other place in the world and Hood River should not neglect them. Furthermore, they are the two varieties which have the highest rank and bring the highest prices.

BAILEY GATZERT
PAYS \$20,000 CHECK

Just a little over three years after the sinking of the dredge Portland by the steamer Bailey Gatzert at Postoffice Bar a check for \$20,000.54 was received by Clerk Doyle, of the Port of Portland Commission, Monday morning from The Dalles, Portland & Astoria Navigation Company, owners of the vessel, which was held by the courts to be at fault.

The original judgment against the Gatzert in the United States Circuit Court here was \$15,000.25, but when the case was appealed and affirmed by the Court of Appeals interest at the rate of 6 per cent was added by the decree of the higher court.

Apple Box Legislation.

A correspondent writes to ask if we look for any apple box legislation during the coming session of Congress. We do not. Legislation pertaining to the fruit industry, while it may be referred to, is not likely to be pressed, because it would be a very difficult matter to obtain action upon it during the few months which the Congress will be in session.—Fruit Trade Journal.
