### LOCAL DEBATERS DISTRICT CHAMPIONS

By a unanimous decision here last Friday night in the debate with their old opponents, the team from Newberg, that of the local high school won the championship of the Columbia River district of the State High School Debating League. The question on which the contestants centered their skill was, Resolved, That the Chinese Exclusion Act Should Be Extended to All Asiatic Peoples. Newberg upheld the affirmative and was represented by Misses Lillian Reuter, Bernice King and Gladys Traw. Miss Viola Nickelsson, Lester Murphy, and Earle Spaulding, victors of past argumentative encounters again won laurels for themselves and a reputation for Hood River. In speaking of the debate Principal J. O. McLaughlin said: "It was very close. The contestants of both sides had excellent delivery, but Hood River excelled in the argument presented and in the arrangement of it." However, R. H. Caine, president of the White Salmon schools and one of the judges was of the opinion that Hood River had excelled at every point. "Miss Reuter was very good," he said, "but Newberg's other two representatives in no way equalled any of the local speakers."

The Newberg speakers took the view that this country had no need for Asiatic laborers. They made an effort to prove that a great number of them were of a criminal tendency and were grossly immoral; and dwelt strongly on the necessity of an immigration and repugnant assimilation as a consequence of an emigration from the far East. Hood River, however, rebutted the point that the labor was unnecessary and maintained that a race question was not imminent because of the transitory residence of the laborers. As to the money sent out of this country to their homes, it was stated, that the wealth created by them more than offset it. Furthermore the local debaters showed that such an exclusion act would violate the spirit of treaties with Eastern nations and would be contrary to the United States Constitution.

For the purposes of the debating league the state is divided into five districts. Mr. McLaughlin states that Hood River's next opponent will probably be the winning team of the Eastern Oregon district. The date, place and subject for the debate will be announced later.

The judges of Friday night's contest were R. H. Caine, of White Salmon; R. C. French, educational director of the Portland Y. M. C. A.; and Bernard Jackway, foreman of the J. G. Mack Furniture Co., of Portland.

### White Salmon Man Disappears.

A White Salmon dispatch to the Oregonian says that no trace has been found of Charles Frick, who disappeared from his five-acre tract three miles up the White Salmon three weeks ago.

Frick feared that someone would "steal" his place and was perturbed when visitors walked on his land to see the Narrows, one of the picturesque spots of the Valley. From the Underwood station, three miles away, he wheeled out all his goods in a barrow and picked out the little piece of land that no one else wanted. He handed it for stones, did his own grubbing, and had several one-year-old trees out.

The Pacific Power & Light Company men came along and asked him for right-of-way, telling him they were willing to pay liberally for his acreage. As soon as the right of way men left Frick dropped his grubbing-hook, locked the cabin door and fled, evidently believing that by keeping out of sight he will not have to give up his land.

Frick lost \$100 recently, all the money he had. Loss of his purse preyed on his mind and may have led to derangement and his strange disappearance.
