## W. N. WHITE MAKES CROP REPORT

W. N. White turned his attention last week to the coming apple crop and to the number of young apple trees planted since June 1, 1908, which he estimated at 50,000,000. The percentage of a normal crop this year as compiled by Mr. White follows: Maine, 98; New Hampshire, 75; Vermont, 80; Massachusetts and Rhode Island, 82; Connecticut, 85; New York, 80; New Jersey and Pennsylvania, 78; Delaware, 86; Maryland, 88; Virginia, 83; West Virginia, 60; North Carolina, 48; South Carolina, 41; Georgia, 50; Ohio, 75; Indiana, 72; Illinois, 75; Michigan, 69; Wisconsin, 88; Minnesota, 91; Iowa, 92; Missouri, 62; South Dakota, 90; Nebraska, 72; Kansas, 69; Kentucky, 55; Tennessee and Alabama, 45; Mississippi, 42; Louisiana, 33; Texas, 64; Oklahoma, 60; Arkansas, 57; Montana, 85; Wyoming, 83; Colorado, 71; New Mexico, 85; Utah, 75; Nevada, 89; Idaho, 87; Washington, 81; Oregon, 75; California, 77.

Said Mr. White: "The Virginias and Northwest have principally young trees, and the quantity will be nearly doubled every year. Many growers in Virginia who had 3,000 to 4,000 barrels last year claim, they will have 10,000 this year. Attention is called to the Middle West, and to the quantity of trees planted which had very poor crops last year."—The Fruit Trade Journal and Produce News.

### Apple Blight in Selah Valley.

A dispatch from Yakima to the Wenatchee Advance says that blight has appeared in the Selah Valley, in the Jonathan and Spitzenberg trees of the orchard of Dr. J. C. Kloeber, president of the Washington state fair. His diagnosis of the ailment is confirmed by Deputy State Horticultural Inspector T. O. Morrison.  
"Kloeber is certainly doing good work," said Mr. Morrison. "He no sooner found the infection in his orchard than he started in to clean it up and to issue a warning to other growers. He has men searching out the infected trees and cutting them. Then a foreman comes along and performs a surgical operation. Disinfectants are used and the diseased parts of the trees are destroyed."

### English Poultryman at O. A. C.

An English poultry specialist, Prof. T. R. Robinson, of Wyke Agricultural College, England has just made a special trip from British Columbia to inspect the poultry plant of the Oregon Agricultural College of which he had heard when making a tour of the Canadian provinces on an investigation of poultry and stock instruction methods there. He expressed surprise at the extent and completeness of the facilities for instruction at the Oregon plant, and stated that the conditions were ideal for successful poultry culture.

### Records Large Mortgage.

County Clerk Hanson recorded last week the mortgage given by the O-W-R. & N. Co. to the Farmers Loan & Trust Co. for the sum of \$175,000,000, the largest amount of any instrument ever filed in the county. The fees, which, however, are \$14 less than those of the \$30,000,000 mortgage registered by the Pacific Power & Light Co. last month, amount to \$66. The power company's instrument was more bulky, containing nearly 150 pages of matter, while the railroad mortgage contains only 97.

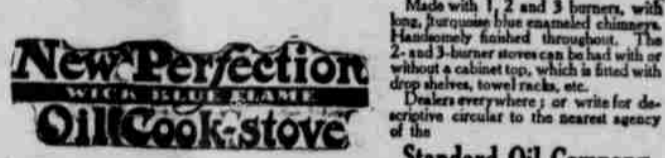

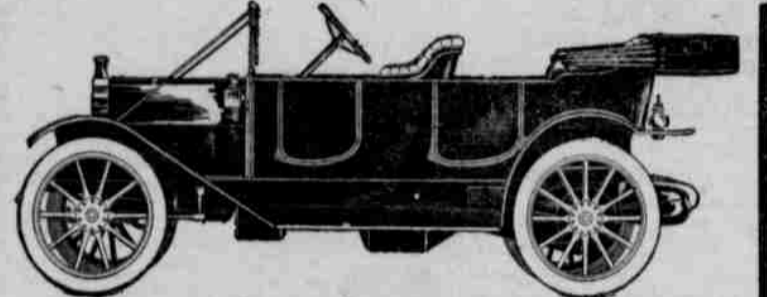
