## SMITH WORKS FOR SPOKANE APPLE SHOW

Arriving here last Thursday, C. L. Smith, of Kiesel, Wash., and a pioneer horticulturist, has been endeavoring to secure an exhibit of local apples at the Spokane National Apple Show. "I believe I represent your growers and your Commercial club," said the Washington horticulturist. "I found a feeling of indifference. Hood River has been at the helm of things for a long time. The fruit from your Valley has won first prize after first prize, but the prosperity has made you indifferent. I have been a close observer for many years, during which time I have been connected with the different agricultural and horticultural institutions of the Northwest, and the indifference that I find here is a plain criterion of prosperity."  
"However, I am not going to give up; for I believe that the world have an exhibit of your fruit at Spokane. You may not get direct returns, but the beneficial effect is sure to be felt indirectly."  
Mr. Smith, who has been a Hood River visitor a number of times before, was at one time connected with the O. R. & N. Co., in its agricultural demonstration department. During recent years he has attended many of the Washington State Farmers' institutes, delivering lectures on horticulture. "The history of how the National Apple Show materialized is an interesting one," said Mr. Smith. "It was an accident. When the State Horticultural society met in Walla Walla five years ago, we citizens of Spokane, in order to secure the convention at our city the next year, offered to put up an apple show. The Chamber of Commerce took the matter up, and it was made to cover the whole Northwest. The first show was a gigantic affair, a great deal larger than we had first expected, at the show of each successive year since then has doubled in magnitude, excellence of exhibits and educational features. The apple industry is the great industry of the Northwest, and the Spokane Apple Show the great apple show. Because of the difficulty in financing the gigantic undertaking, it was at first decided this year not to have the show. However, the Spokane business men said that if we laid down on the thing that way it would have a bad effect on the industry. They raised the money, \$42,500, in four days, and now we are trying to get the Northwest's applegrowers to show their appreciation of the work by coming through with exhibits."  
"The ratings of the show have been changed, and any region may now enter. The former very objectionable variety rating has been wiped out. The eastern professors of horticulture do not know how to judge our western apples so we have created C. J. Shively, of Boise, Idaho, as chief judge."  
Mr. Smith came here from Boise, where he was judge of the county exhibits at the recent fair in that city.  
Mr. Smith has the greatest praise for growers of the Hood River apples. They were the first to adopt the methods of successful commercial orcharding he said. All other Northwestern regions are followers of them.

## CADET EXAMINATION NEXT JANUARY

The University of Oregon will hold a competitive examination for two appointments to the Naval Academy at Annapolis on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, January 25, 26, and 27, 1912. The appointments are the patronage of Senator Chamberlain, who has agreed to appoint as cadets to the Naval Academy in May of 1912 the two candidates in the examinations who pass the best mental and physical tests. The examinations will be wholly competitive, and are open to any young man in the state who is a citizen of the United States.  
In addition to an age qualification, and a strict physical test, applicants will be examined in the following subjects: Algebra, Plane Geometry, English Grammar, English Literature, English Composition, Geography and History, the latter including History of the United States, Ancient History, and History of Medieval Europe.  
Candidates for this examination should send in their names to the President's Secretary, University of Oregon, Eugene, for registration.

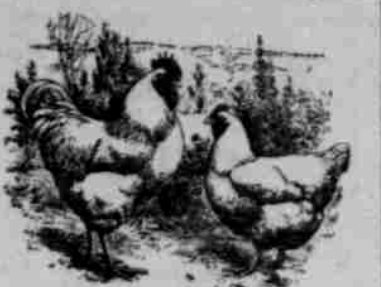
