TAX INCREASE OF MANY MILLIONS

The total assessed valuation of the State of Oregon will probably be \$500,000,000 as compared with \$544,000,000 of last year.
The final report from the County Assessors has been received by the State Tax Commission.
The total assessed valuation for the state was shown by the rolls of the County Assessors is \$783,040,217. Last year the total assessed by the county Assessors was \$747,624,404 or an increase of \$35,415,813 for this year, the percentage of increase being between 4 and 5 per cent.
The assessments as made by the County Assessors do not include assessments for public service corporations. The assessments of these corporations by the State Tax Commission will probably total about \$90,000,000.

Christmas Vacation Begins Tomorrow.
The Christmas vacation of the city schools will begin tomorrow and will continue until Tuesday, January 2. During the holidays the School Board has decided to make repairs to the furnace of the Pleasant View school on the Heights. An improved ventilating apparatus will also be installed in the building. It will thus be provided with ample fresh air and made as healthful as possible.

On school children's day at the big St. Paul land show last week, when thousands of youngsters viewed the exhibits. Each pupil was promised an apple by the management, and after 12,000 had been given away, exhausting the supply, the impatient youngsters rushed the distributors and only the effective work of a squad of policemen and the officials of the show prevented a riot.
