During Lent every day except Sucday is a fast day, All the Wedtesdays and Fridays, and the Saturdays and Embler week and Holy week are also days of com-plete abstinence from flesh meat, Only those must fast who have completed their twenty-first year and have not reached their sixtieth. The fol-lowing, however, are excepted: The those in feeble health, women oursing children and all who are en laborious and exhaustive

On fast days only one full meel may Custom permits coffee, ten or chocolate, with a small piece of bread, to be taken in the morning. Custom also allows the use of eggs, butter or cheese, and milk at the even-ing collation. When the principal meal cannot be taken at mid-day, it may be taken in the evening, and the collation Flesh most may be used at all meal

on Sunday, and once a day at the principal meal on Mondays, Tuesdays and Those, however, who are excused from fasting on account of age or hard labor may use fresh meat more than once a day, on the days when it sings is permitted in the preparatio of abstinence food.

Fish and flesh are not allowed at the ame meal, even on Sundays, except i case of persons dispensed from abstin All Catholics must abstain who have eached the age of reason, unless nealth does not permit. Two excep-

Workingmen and working women Workingmen and working women, together with their entire families, are permitted the use of flesh meat once a day on all fast days of the year, except Fridays, Ash Wednesday, the Wednesday and Saturday of Holy week and the Vigil of Christmas.
