PRESS COMMENTS ON SCOUT RESCUE

(From the Oregonian.)
Had the Boy Scouts of Hood River not been given the military training against which the Socialists and I. W. W. declaim, they could not have saved their comrades from drowning. That training prompted Simpson to call on his companions to form a living chain when he found himself alone unable to rescue. Heell and it prompted them to respond promptly. It had taught them exactly what to do when called upon for help and had taught them to do it quickly and efficiently without the loss of one precious second. Boy Scout training had instructed the boys what to do in order to expel the water from the drowning boys' lungs and to revive them after dragging them to shore.

This incident is a practical demonstration that the Boy Scouts are not a military, but a peaceful organization. They apply what is useful in military training to the preservation instead of the destruction of life. They turn military training to peaceful, humane uses.

This is not to say that, if the country called upon its citizens to fight in its defense, the Boy Scouts would not respond. They are taught not only to become useful, humane citizens in time of peace, but patriots also. This teaching is what inspires the hatred of Socialists and industrial workers. Not that these organizations love peace; they stir up a world-wide warfare against class, so bitter and so all-embracing that it ignores all national boundaries. The votaries of the red flag hate the stars and stripes because the national flag sets loyalty to country above strife between classes and claims the loyalty alike of rich and poor, of capitalist and workman. If the nation called on its citizens to fight, the Boy Scouts would respond—as individuals, not as an organization—and would be the better soldiers for that military training which was given them solely for use in the arts of peace.

But the Boy Scouts are not patriots of the Hobson type, who seek every pretext for war. By correspondence and visits between Scouts of different nations they aid in removing misunderstandings and promoting a good understanding between nations. They thus aid in removing the first beginnings of the causes of war and are a powerful influence for peace.

When a number of boys are in swimming and one is taken with a cramp and is in danger of drowning twenty feet from shore, what is the best way to be rescued? A sudden shifting takes place, and one, far braver than the rest, risks his life to save his comrade. The rest form an excited group. Suppose then that the rescuer is gripped by the drowning one and he is himself in desperate danger. What then? The scare is apt to spread among the others, and both drown. So far it is an old story.

But if, following the previous teaching, there is no scare, but a living chain of boys is immediately formed, the head of which, pushed forward, reaches the drowning boys and all are dragged to land and safety, is that training worth nothing?

Again, if both the drowning boys are in a bad plight when brought to land, but their comrades at once follow the "first aid to the drowning" directions, without waiting for doctors or even for adult assistance, is that a justification of the training all these boys had?

But this was Boy Scout work at Hood River and no goodly goodly tale.

TELEPHONE CABLE CONNECTION FINISHED

A crew of men completed the work of connecting the lines of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. on each side of the Columbia with the big cable stretched across the stream here last winter. Hood River now has three different lines with White Salmon. The cable here, with the exception of one at Vancouver, is the only one stretching across the Columbia. The big leaden tube containing the telephone wires is almost a mile long.

The Pacific Co. has also just finished stretching another wire between here and The Dalles.

Box Apples Take Consumers' Eyes

An incident of the increased cost of living was unfolded to the members of the Indiana apple shippers' commission, which met here recently. The commission has received letters from a large number of apple growers and dealers containing suggestions for display.

"Boxing the apples is the demand of the buyers of today," wrote one man, "and they insist on boxes, even when it makes the fruit cost more. A short time ago I received a barrel of fine apples, which I offered in my store for \$2 for the barrel. I kept them for two weeks, but I couldn't sell them. Finally I placed them in two standard boxes, which I sold for \$2 a box, the same man taking both, and a half bushel left. The buyer had refused to consider the barrel at \$2."—Indianapolis, Ind., News.

P. P. & L. TO CROSS RIVER BY AERIAL WAY

"As soon as a right way can be secured from J. B. Koberg, whose ranch surrounds Stanley Rock, from which point an aerial line of the Pacific Power & Light Co. is planned to leave this bank to connect with the Husum line of the company in Washington, the management will begin the construction of the overhead transmission line," says Albert Hall, manager of the Hood River Gas & Electric Co. of this city. The right of way was recently vacated by the Pacific Telephone Co., the lines of which now cross the river by cable.

The Pacific Power & Light Co. has three lines crossing the Columbia at the following points: Priest's Rapids, Pasco and Pendleton. The Hood River line, which will be 1,382 feet, will be the longest over the Columbia.

Under the supervision of Chief Engineer Galvani, H. F. Parsons has been busy during the past week with a crew of men resurveying the high power line between this city and The Dalles. P. M. Morse, city engineer of Hood River, has just completed the survey of an extension line of the company in the Mount Hood district and a crew of men is now busy in that community stretching the lines.
