STONE EXHIBITS CORN TELLS DOCK NEEDS FROM MARKLEY PLACE

Editor Glacier:

Hood River needs a central landing for all boats and steamers to encourage the river traffic, which is almost a minus quantity at the present time with the persent conditions. By having a central landing and joint agency it would eliminate a great deal of inconvenience and expense for the travers.

"It makes me a little sore, when I come to town at this season of the year, and they ask me if it is snowing out in our country," said D. I. Stone, whose ranch is the last on the Lost Lake road and one of the most remote in the country, and who was in the city on business last week. "We, of course, have more snow in the winter than you have in the Lower Valley.

on business last week. "We, of course, have more snow in the winter convenience and expense for the traveling public and freight shippers, as may readily be seen without any explanation. Also, with the steamboat business, it would eliminate the necessity and enormous expense of keeping up four landing places, which is now the case, and save the expense of having so many agents, and consequently give each steamer a fair show, which is directly a benefit to the shippers.

The shipping te and from Hood River is a very large item and is now being practically all handled by the railroad companies. We must have river competition to keep down rates and keep up the service. With the opening of the Panama canal and the Celilo locks and canal the Columbia river will be a leading outlet for Hood River produce to the south ard east part of the United States as well as all of the oriental countries and we must have an efficient landing place for all steamers.
