There are three propositions to consider. First, to build a jetty out from the Washington shore, about the distance of a mile up river from the White Salmon ferry landing, turning the Columbia channel towards the mouth of Hood river, then by dredging out the upper end of the bar, a space 3000 feet wide and three-fourths of a mile long, with an average depth of 15 feet from its present height. This current would keep it dredged or cashed out. However, this being a government proposition, it would cause a filling in on the Washington shore at the United States dock.

Second, to build a dock starting at the O.-W. R. & N. depot running north-east across the Hood River, turning the Columbia channel towards the mouth of Hood river, then by dredging out the river in front of it, as far as the present rocky bar, the distance of a mile from the dock, outside the ferry landing to Stanley Rock. The steamers run to Stanley rock and then down on the inside of this bar at low water but this will soon be impossible as that is fast filling in.

Third, to build a dock extending north from the end of Second street from the place known as the Point, starting at a level with the road and running north across the bar, a distance of 3000 feet, to deep water, it being 18 feet above low water at the outer end. This will be at a place equidistant from the United States dock and Underwood dock and making a ferry landing for both ferries, thus combining the traffic and making conveyance easier to and from the face of the dock to Hood River. This can be done with very reasonable expense, as the driving of piling is easy and no river or creek to cross.

The river rises and falls about 20 feet. Then this dock would be covered at 18 feet, but at that stage the steamers are able to land in the mouth of the slough and at 20 feet at the feet of the dam, a distance of a dock a slight while under water. This proposition would give Hood River a central landing place for all steamers and ferries and would attract a great deal of business to Hood River, which now goes to Portland and elsewhere, because of such poor accommodations from the boat landings to town.

This is a county proposition to be promoted by the county, and if it feels that it can not make a free dock, then charge a rental for each ferry and steam boat, and even at a minimum charge it would pay \$1800 per year for rental alone. Then by making a dock, the agency the steamers could operate with much less expense than at present with more efficient ways of handling freight.

Uses of Quicksilver

Quicksilver is used mainly, according to the United States Geological Survey, in the manufacture of fulminate for explosive caps, of drugs, of electric lighting and scientific apparatus, and in the recovery of the precious metals, especially of gold, by amalgamation. An increasing demand has been reported by manufacturers of electric appliances. An interesting and increasing use in Scotland is the floating of the lights of lighthouses upon a body of quicksilver. The metal is no longer used, of course, and the loss in use is insignificant. Concerning this Consul Fleming writes as follows: "Quantities of quicksilver used in Edinburgh are for resilvering mirrors and for 'floating' the revolving lights in lighthouses. The commissioners of northern lighthouses, Edinburgh, have in their charge 90 light houses on the coast of Scotland. Up to the year 1900 the revolving lights were borne on rollers. The 'float' system has been gradually introduced, however, and is now in operation at 30 coast stations and will be used at all others. The lighting machinery rests on a pontoon which runs on quicksilver in a groove. The quantity of mercury required for this purpose in a lighthouse is from seven to eight flasks of 75 pounds each. As the waste is trifling, the total present demand for this purpose is small.

Forest Notes

Squirrels collect much of the seed used for planting by the forest service. A growing scarcity of willow, generally used for wooden shoes in Europe is leading to an adoption of poplar. Torrey pine, a distinct California species, had been found in only two isolated localities in the southern part of the state. One hundred acres on the Florida national forest will be sown to maritime pine seed this fall. Maritime pine is the source of the French turpentine industry. San Francisco recently received its first cargo of lumber from the Tongass national forest, Alaska. The shipment consisted of 1,500,000 feet of Sitka spruce. Three native species of larch furnish lumber in the United States. One grows in New England and the lake states, another in the Pacific northwest and the third in the high mountains of the northern Rockies. European larch has been planted extensively in the Pacific States.

Sailing Wheelbarrows in China

The sailing wheelbarrows of China, as shown in the October Popular Mechanics Magazine cover design, are a sight to delight the eyes of an old salt stranded inland, particularly in the Shenai district, where mile-long processions of these queer vehicles may be met with. Wheelbarrow transportation, states an article, would be almost impossible in this district, due to the blown sand, were it not for the ingeniously devised sails. Night and day, for months at a stretch, wind and weather, the wind blows steadily from west to east at an average velocity of more than 15 miles an hour. Luckily this chance to be the direction of the country's produce transportation, so that the heaviest laden of the barrow craft are able to "make port" with a fair wind. A wind "dead astern," however, is by no means absolutely necessary, for, by ingeniously contrived supports on the sides of the barrows, the sails may be set to take advantage of almost every slant of breeze.
