One of the finest fields of hay seen in the valley this year, and if all of the clover, wheat and vetch and alfalfa now ready for harvest can be saved, but little hay will have to be imported this year.

Loganberries are invading the eastern markets for the first time since the industry has been established in Oregon. More than 25 carloads will be sent east in refrigerator cars by express to supply the newly created demand.
