### JOEL C. STRAUB, CIVIL WAR VETERAN DEAD

Another Civil war veteran, Joel C. Straub, answered the last call Wednesday night of last week. Mr. Straub, who was 79 years of age, passed away at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Cora Orans, with whom he has been residing since 1910. His death was caused from cancer.

Joel C. Straub led an eventful career just before and during the Civil war. He was a native of Ohio, having been born at Waldo, July 1, 1837. In 1856 he went to Kansas with a party of men from his home county, Marion county, to lend assistance to the Kansas Free State men. He was with John Brown at Assawatomie, where the famed abolitionist was repulsed by border ruffians. The Brown party returned to Assawatomie after two weeks to find but two buildings remaining, the others having been burned by the ruffians. Mr. Straub was one of the followers of James Lane and Gen. Harley. At the time of John Brown's raid at Harper's Ferry, he was in Memphis, Tenn.

### ASSOCIATION PEAR POOLS GRATIFYING

With the exception of a negligible quantity of Winter Nellis, the Apple Growers Association has closed its pools on the year's pear crop. Shipping a total of 48 cars of various grades, the association handled about 75 per cent of the pears of the valley.

### FORMER GOLDENDALE MAYOR CONVICTED

The case of Nathaniel L. Ward, ex-mayor of Goldendale and well known as an attorney, who was convicted by a jury on an embezzlement charge in the superior court last January, came up again last week, and Ward was sentenced by Judge Back of Vancouver, who acted as the trial judge, to serve from six months to 15 years at hard labor in the state penitentiary at Walla Walla, according to a dispatch from Goldendale. Judge Back overruled a motion for a new trial in the case some time ago.

### A LOCAL PIONEER DIES IN PORTLAND

The remains of the late Lyman Smith, whose death occurred Wednesday morning of last week at the home of his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Will Smith, of Portland, were buried here last Friday morning at Idelwilde on the 40th anniversary of his arrival in the Hood River valley. Mr. Smith was a member of the colony of settlers who arrived here from Elmira, N. Y., and Pennsylvania points on November 12, 1875. For many years he was prominent in Hood River affairs. He owned a large farm just west of the city. The spring from which a portion of Hood River's water supply was formerly secured was located on his place.

F. W. Dehart has purchased a ranch near Sherman, Ore., 18 miles south of Portland, and expects soon to remove part of his family to the same. Bert Veach has resigned his position as superintendent of the Goddard farm and intends in the near future to locate in Clatsop county, perhaps in the neighborhood of Vancouver. Mr. and Mrs. Veach will be much missed in this vicinity, as they are among the original pioneers and enjoy a very large acquaintance and have a great many friends. They have been helpful neighbors, believing in doing all they can and making no fuss about it.

Death of Infant The body of the three months old infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Bellamy was buried last Friday afternoon at Idelwilde cemetery, after funeral services conducted by Rev. W. R. L. Giesch. The child died last Tuesday.

Grange Thanks Railways The following resolution of thanks to the Mount Hood Railway Co. and the O. W. R. & N. Co. was recently adopted by the Pine Grove grange: "Whereas, the Mount Hood Railroad has made material reductions on some of its local freight rates and whereas, the Mount Hood company and the O. W. R. & N. Co. have absorbed some of the local freight on through shipments of apples.

### LOCAL ORCHARDS PROLIFIC BEARERS

While the local apple crop in the aggregate is below normal, some of the orchards of individual growers have borne bumper crops. J. H. Day, an East Side orchardist, says he has harvested from a two acre tract 1,000 boxes more fruit than expected. Mr. Day has gathered and packed a total of 6,300 boxes from his place. He will average more than \$1 per box from his fruit sales.

### COOPER & LARAWAY MEN MAKE RECORDS

Both packing and picking records have been broken this year in local orchards. The record of pickers is held by Sam Carr, Chet Vincent, D. H. Quick and Thomas Henstead, who assisted in the harvest of the crop on the ranch of W. F. Cooper and W. F. Laraway. One day these men harvested 450 boxes and on another picked 525 boxes of fruit. The average picker will harvest no more than 80 boxes of apples per day.

### Monmouth State Normal Notes

The O. N. S. summer school enrollment reached a total of 508, which as far as we are informed, is the largest enrollment the school has ever had at any one time. This, together with the enrollment for this semester, makes a grand total of nearly 900 students, which is indicative of the steady growth of the normal school idea in Oregon, due to the painstaking methods and the wise leadership of President Ackerman.
