### COMMERCIAL CLASS SEES BANK MACHINE

The mechanism for a newly installed electric posting machine was explained to the student by C. H. Vaughan, cashier of the bank.

### NOTICE TO BIDDERS

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to an order of the County Court of Hood River County, Oregon, duly made and entered, the said County Court will on the 4th day of December, 1915, at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. of said day, in the County Court room in the City of Hood River, Oregon, receive sealed bids for the construction of one eleven (11) span frame trestle bridge across Collins Creek in the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 31, Township 2 North, Range 10 East of the W. M., in Hood River County, Oregon, in accordance with the principal and alternate plan provided for in the plans and specifications for said improvement now on file with the County Clerk of said County, which for more definite information may be seen and examined by prospective bidders.

Bids must be made on both principal and alternate plans separately for consideration of the Court, and said improvement will be made under the supervision of the County Roadmaster of said County. Each bidder will be required to deposit with his bid, a certified check in favor of said County for five (5) per cent of the amount of said bid, which will be forfeited to the County in case the award is made to such bidder and he fails, neglects or refuses for a period of five (5) days after such award is made, to enter into the contracts and file his bond in a sum equal to not less than 50 per cent of the contract price, conditioned that the contractor shall well and truly in a manner satisfactory to the County Court, and in accordance with the said plans and specifications, complete the work contracted for and save the County harmless from all expense incurred to complete the work within the time hereinafter mentioned. That he will make the payments promptly to all persons supplying said contractor with labor and materials for the prosecution of said work; said improvement shall be completed within thirty (30) working days from the date of the award of the contract, which contract will be let and entered into with the successful bidder on or before the 5th day after the date herein set for the reception of bids. Said contract will be let to the lowest responsible bidder, the County reserving the right to reject any and all bids.
