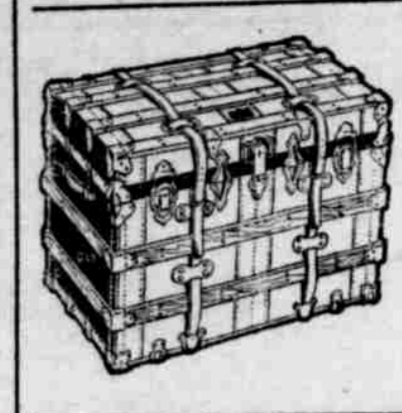
Ken Has Lunch Repaired
