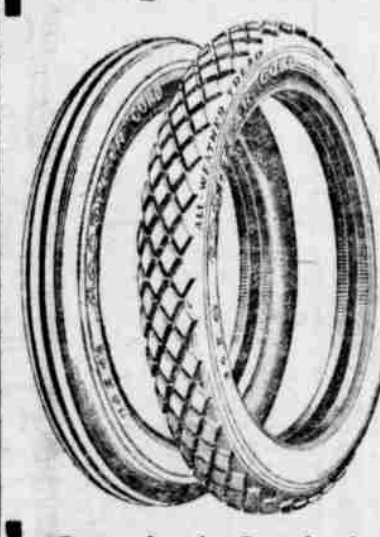
Name Asked for Road
