A ledger is also handy for the visitor from out of town to register his name in, so that additional literature can be mailed to him upon inquiry.

The chamber of commerce club room has done an unlimited amount of good through its use by the members in helping the national government through its Red Cross, Liberty Bond sales etc., for which it should be highly commended.
