WOMEN OFFER SUBSTITUTE REMEDIES

As white flour sales on the 3950 barrels were resumed July 5 under permission issued by State Food Administrator W. H. Ayer, a warning against hoarding and a plea for continued conservation of wheat, sugar and meat was made by Mr. Ayer.

This summary of wheat and flour regulations was issued as a guide:

"Sugar--For domestic consumption, three pounds a person a month."

"Restaurants, hotels and all public eating places are permitted to use only three pounds of sugar for every ten meals served."

"Wheat flour--Mondays and Wednesdays in every week and the even days in every day are available. At all other times bread must contain no less than 25 per cent of substitutes and pastry, cakes, pies and all other things not less than one-third substitutes."

"The total consumption of wheat flour for all purposes is limited to six pounds per person a month."

Wax Recipes Are Given

The following recipes are reliable and anyone desiring to know anything they do not understand about them may send up the person whose name is given with each recipe:

50-50 Rice Bread--White

Two cups of rice, cooked in 4 cups of water until well done, 1 cup of milk and 1 cup of water scalded, 1 cup of Fleischmann's yeast dissolved in 1/2 cup of warm water, 2 tablespoons of sugar, 1 tablespoon of salt, 1 tablespoon of shortening, 1/2 teaspoon of soda, 1/2 cup of raisins. Have rice cooled and mix with white flour as for any white bread, letting it rise, knead down, mould into loaves, let rise again and bake.

Potato Bread

One cake of Fleischmann's yeast, 2 quarts of mashed potato, 1 cup of potato water, 1 T. salt, 2 T. sugar, 1 T. shortening (all rounded). Dissolve yeast in 1/2 cup of lukewarm water, add to mashed potato and potato water and sugar. Let stand until morning. All salt and melted shortening and flour to make stiff loaf. Let raise, knead into loaves, let raise again and bake 45 to 50 minutes. Mix a little stiffer than for all wheat bread. Four loaves.

Spiced Cake

One-third cup of shortening, 3/4 cup of sugar, 1 egg, 2 cups of barley flour, 1/2 teaspoon of cloves, 1/2 teaspoon of cinnamon, 3/4 teaspoon of allspice, 1/2 teaspoon of nutmeg, 3/4 cup of raisins, 1/2 cup of baking powder, 1 cup of milk, 1/2 cup of chopped citron. Bake 35 to 40 minutes in a moderate oven.

Ground Rolled Out Cookies

Two cups of ground rolled outs, 1 cup of sugar, 2 1/2 cups of shortening, 1 egg of four milk, 1 egg well beaten, 1/2 cup of syrup. Sift together and add 1/2 cups of barley flour, 1/2 cup of cornstarch, 1 teaspoon of soda, 1/2 teaspoon of cloves, 1/2 teaspoon of nutmeg and 1 tablespoon of cinnamon. One cup of raisins may be added.

SNYNOTT TO HOLD ARMY, NAVY EXAMS

Congressman Nick Snynott will hold competitive examinations open to every eligible boy in the Second Oregon District, for the West Point Military and Annapolis Naval Academies on October 19, 1918.

The examinations, which will be given for the congressman by the United States Civil Service Commission, will be held simultaneously in the following eight cities: Klamath Falls, Ontario, Baker, Pendleton, Goldsboro, Bend, LaGrande and The Dalles.

Those candidates standing highest in each examination will be appointed as principals and alternates in order of standing to fill the one vacancy at West Point and one in Annapolis. Such successful candidates will take the official examinations in the spring of 1919 and if successful in same will enter the academies in June.

Candidates to be eligible must be bona fide residents of the Second Oregon District, and if trying for the West Point cadetship must be between 17 and 22 years of age on the date of admission; and if for appointment as midshipman at Annapolis between the ages of 16 and 20 at date of official examination.

Those interested should write at once to Hon. N. J. Snynott, Room 242, House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., stating whether they prefer the naval or military academy and requesting any of number giving full information and sample questions.

Recipe for Canning Salmon

The following recipe for canning salmon is given by Cecil Holman, an experienced fisherman, who cures his

own salmon each year. It has been tried by a number of local housewives, who have met with success.

Dress fish and wash thoroughly through several waters. Cut them up, put in can, a teaspoonful of salt to the pint; place lids on cans, clamp on lids. Place cans in cold water, allowing cans to remain above surface. After water comes to boil, allow them to remain on stove for four hours. Add teaspoon of soft water used for boiling cans and you get better heat.

Put the salt in the cans before putting in fish. If steelheads are canned add olive oil.
