The local club, the members of which have been playing regularly on the huge sand bar north of the city, will probably join Mr. Stone in entering the tournament.

Rose Hopper Control Suggested

Rose gardeners, according to Leroy Childs, should spray immediately for control of the rose leaf hopper, one of the most worrysome pests for Oregon rose fanciers. Mr. Childs says the pest prevails in all parts of the state. The hopper should be sprayed with a solution of Black Leaf 40 at the rate of 1 to 1200 and soap, four pounds to 100 gallons of water. As the insect will be found on the under side of the foliage, the spray must be directed upward.
