**MR. BIRGE GIVES YELLOWSTONE DATA**

E. W. Birge, director of the Apple Growers Association, who with his wife was back last week from a motor and camping tour of eastern Washington, Idaho and the Yellowstone Park, warns motorists from attempting long tours and depending on local road information. He declares that the most authentic and satisfactory data may be secured from the organized and dependable tourist bureaus and automobile clubs.

Mr. and Mrs. Birge left Hood River on July 19, traveling east by way of Coquille, Walla Walla and Spokane. In sizing up the general situation of roads encountered, Mr. Birge says:

We found them good, had and indifferent en route to Missoula. The Yellowstone Trail via Coeur D'Alene and Wallace is the most direct route, but serious forest fires in the region of St. Regis, Mont., rendered travel dangerous or impossible. At Thompson Falls forest fires were encountered, but they were under control and we were permitted to pass.

The roads from Missoula to Butte are for the most part in splendid condition; from Butte to Bozeman fair, for the most part; and from Bozeman to the western entrance to Yellowstone, a distance of 225 miles, good, making a good day's run. The road up West Gallatin river canyon, from Bozeman, is very scenic and while some construction work is encountered, it will pay the tourist to take this route. Cutthroat trout fishing in the West Gallatin and Grayling creek are all that one can desire, and the limit of 20 can be taken in a few hours. At the Park entrance we were required to register and deliver all firearms, and incidentally \$7.50; the former were returned on our leaving the park. Automobile and camping parties from every part of the world are constantly in evidence, and the wonders of the park exceed your fondest dreams.

We returned by way of Wallace and Coeur D'Alene, the St. Regis fire having burned itself out. It was sickening to see the vast areas of timber that had been burned over and destroyed.

From Wallace, Ida., to the summit of the Coeur D'Alene mountains over the Montana Idaho divide probably the worst road on the trip was encountered through what is known as Fourth of July Canyon. It was well named, for one strikes firecrackers all the way. This, in time, however, will be a splendid highway, as road work is in progress, and eventually it will be the logical route between Spokane and Missoula.

I would suggest as the best route between Hood River and Spokane to travel by way of White Salmon, Lyle, Goldendale, Walla Walla, Lewiston, Ina, Pullman and Colfax.

**Dan Wulle Coming Soon**

A. E. Woolpert, northwestern manager for Dan Wulle & Co., London apple merchants, has received a radiogram from the head of the firm, announcing that he is now en route to America for a tour of all fruit districts. Mr. Wulle landed at New York Monday. He will reach the Northwest about September 1. It is likely that his visit will result in the expansion of Northwestern branches, according to Mr. Woolpert.

The London concern is already the heaviest buyer of Northwestern boxed apples this year, and has established permanent receiving stations here and at all points on the line of the Mt. Hood R. R. Co. Mr. Woolpert estimates that more than 100,000 boxes of fruit have been bought. A deal was closed last week for the purchase of 10,000 boxes from an East Side grower at an average of about \$2.10 per box.

The best price for a pre-harvest sale of Mid-Columbia apples is reported by J. E. Slade, whose orchard at Husum, Wash., will yield an estimated 12,000 boxes of high class fruit. Mr. Slade has sold to the Northwestern Fruit Exchange for an average of approximately \$2.20 per box. Several concerns were dickering with Mr. Slade for his crop, and a deal with a Philadelphia concern had reached the point where litigation seemed eminent, following the close of a contract with the Northwestern Fruit Exchange.

**Loomis Praises Quality**

R. E. Loomis, New York apple merchant, who owns an extensive orchard property near Parkdale, has arrived here to spend a vacation of several weeks. Mr. Loomis, who expresses optimism over the 1919 deal, declares that he has never seen the crop of the Hood River Valley indicating better quality at this season of the year. All other box districts, he says, will produce heavy yields of apples better in quality than on average years.

Mr. Loomis expects his own Upper Valley orchards to yield 12,000 boxes this season.

**Mrs. Davidson's Apartments Entered**

Mrs. H. F. Davidson experienced a terrifying few minutes one night last week when she discovered an intruder in her apartments. **Lage's Wheat Sets Record**

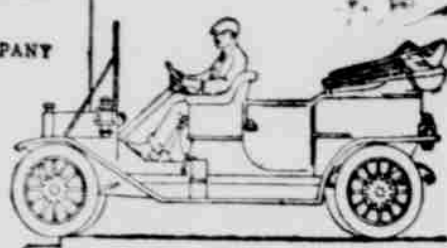
The best crop of wheat ever cut in the Hood River Valley has just been harvested on the Lage farm on the East Side. Of the Big Club variety, the seven acres of grain, it is estimated will yield close to 400 bushels. Cutting of Hood River Valley wheat is well over both in the Upper and Lower Hood River Valleys, and it is estimated that the total yield will reach close to 15,000 bushels.
