**VAST APPLE TONNAGE TO BE CANNED**

With apples stored in every available warehouse in the city, according to The Dulles Chronicle, the great canning plant of Libby, McNeil & Libby is beginning its canning of apples which is estimated will keep the plant operating at full blast until February 1. The plant will put up 75,000 cases of canned apples, the year's output, 25,000 cases of apple butter. Probably a third of this enormous output will be exported to the countries of Europe. England alone is anxious to contract for double the output of the plant. However, the firm of Libby, McNeil & Libby believes in taking care of domestic consumption first. The company has had a corps of buyers here securing all available tonnage.

**K. OF P. BAND IS ROUNDING INTO SHAPE**

The Knights of Pythias band, the members of which began their first lessons six weeks ago under directorship of Chas. H. Schultz, a former and instrument teacher of California public schools and a San Francisco orchestra player, has had its first ensemble rehearsal. The music master praised the men for their aptitude in learning. The band members will continue their daily lessons and weekly practice by all members will be held Friday evening at the court house. Hood River has been without a regular band for some years, and members of the fraternal order conceived the idea of organizing a musical aggregation for the promotion of civic pride. Following next year, the clamor of former public occasions, when band music was lacking, will be eliminated.

**Clipped Here and There**

From Hood River, the apple center of Oregon if not the entire country, comes continual word of distress among farmers and business men on account of Japanese ownership. It is shown that wise men from the islands of the sea are buying the choicest orchard land in the Hood River valley, creating a center of Oriental life and customs which must certainly lead to conditions entirely out of keeping with the prospects of the richest section of the state a few years ago.

The Telegram sounded the alarm against the purchase of land in Hood River valley by Japanese. To be exact, it was in October, 1915, that three or four articles were published, in which the problems of apple production and marketing were discussed. In the article printed October 9, the following warning against Japanese ownership was printed: "The stranger landing at the depot in Hood River must be struck with the 'yellow peril' when he is approached by a real Japanese 'runner', decked out with a cap bearing in gilt letters the name of a prominent hotel. A Japanese hotel runner would be new in many Oregon towns, much less would the innovation be expected in a high class apple city. On inquiry it is ascertained that the hotel runner is one of about 500 Japanese who have become fixtures in the valley. Japanese pick and pack strawberries and apples and pears; they clear land; they cultivate and care for trees. Lately they have been buying land, real apple land, and they are rapidly becoming owners of orchards. In every district of the valley Japanese are getting title to land and they are paying for it, too. Thus far the white growers have considered the Japanese as servants; they are soon to realize the change to landlords. Something of the condition can be gathered from the fact that one of every 16 persons one meets in Hood River county is a Japanese. And the whole colony has come to stay within less than 10 years."

It is only just to the Japanese to say they are of the most conservative type of land buyers. First as workers of the soil, then as tenants, then as owners of the land, Japanese invade a district and become permanent residents. They do not hastily colonize and speculate. They study every condition, and then develop markets. There is no disposition among Japanese, either those with resources or those without, to kite land values and rob the newcomer. In this fact lies much of the certainty of the success of ventures projected by the little yellow men.

Hood River is not the only section of the Northwest that has or will have the Japanese problem to contend with and to solve. Two or three sections of the state of Washington have large colonies of Japanese. In Oregon, other sections are threatened with the same peril that has been recognized, even though too late, at Hood River.—Portland Telegram.

**Lyle-White Salmon Road Muddy**  
Chas. S. Crawford, of Salem, en route home by automobile from Toppish, where with friends he has been hunting bear and deer, reported while here last week that the stretch between Toppish and Goldendale over the Sinecoo Indian reservation was in fair condition. He says they traveled for 50 miles over the high prairie country without seeing a habitation.

"The worst road I struck between here and Toppish," said Mr. Crawford, "was between Lyle and White Salmon. The recent snow and rains have made this stretch very muddy and full of bad, wet holes."
