Pursuant to Chapter 234 of the General Laws of Oregon, for the year 1913, and by order of the County Court, notice is hereby given to the taxpayers of Hood River County, that the County Court of said County will convene on the 24th day of December, 1919, at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon, at the Court House in the City of Hood River in said County for the purpose of discussing with the taxpayers of said County the proposed estimate of Taxes to be levied for the year 1920 as hereinafter contained.

The Court will remain in session during the entire day, and if it shall appear to the Court that all taxpayers who desire to discuss the proposed budget have not had an opportunity to be fully heard on said day, Court will adjourn to the following day for the purpose of completing the discussion of the proposed tax levy.
