FISH SQUABBLE IS DISCUSSED LOCALLY

Interest in the election and annual meeting of the Hood River County Game Protective Association last night increased through the preceding week as indications were dropped that the action of the State Fish & Game Commission in ousting State Biologist Finley would be discussed. While members of the organization, one of the strongest leagues of sportsmen in the state, were hesitant in expressing themselves, the general sentiment seemed to favor Mr. Finley.

Open criticism of Governor Olcott's vacillations in the matter were made, and sentiment of sportsmen indicated that the proposal of one commission instead of one to handle game and commercial fishing would be opposed. As resolutions on the matter were in prospect the meeting was well attended. State Game Warden Shoemaker was present.

The squabble called forth a letter of protest from J. D. McCully to the Oregonian. Mr. McCully wrote: "The office of game commissioner appears to be a football for Oregon governors.

"Gov. Olcott now arises to his opportunity for an inning. In order to retire the present board for its insubordination and make the going easy the governor proposes that we have two commissions instead of one.

"It seems to me that some of our officials lie awake nights studying some new scheme to tap the public purse. If there is a crying need for the legislature to do one thing more than another it is to cut out a few commissions instead of forming new ones. It is about time for the public to have its inning and reduce the number of tax eaters.

"There is no official from the president to the lowest whose acts in handling public money should not be subject to scrutiny and control.

"Publicity keeps many of us honest and incorruptible."



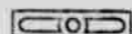

STATE ROAD MAINTENANCE SUPPORTED

The application of the county court of Columbia county to the legislature for adoption of a bill that will provide for state maintenance of all state highways finds fairly unanimous support here.

The Hood River county court has approved the appeal of their fellow officials by unanimous resolution. Business interests and orchardists have expressed a favorable sentiment and letters have already gone forward to W. D. Bolton, of Friend, asking his support of the proposed bill. Citizens will write their approval to other legislators, and a delegation will personally interview J. R. Nickelsen.

APPLES TRUCKED OVER HIGHWAY

Five of the large motor trucks, caught in the recent snowstorm while engaged in hauling crushed rock and gravel for surfacing local stretches of the Columbia Highway, left last week for Portland, where construction work calls them. In most instances the trucks have loaded heavy loads of apples. The loads not only enable the owners to make the trips at a profit, as freightage of 25 cents per box is paid for delivery of the fruit to Portland commission houses, but furnishes better traction for negotiating the icy roads.

MANY WILL PLANT STRAWBERRY TRACTS

Numerous ranchers of the Upper Valley will plant tracts of strawberries the coming spring. The demand for Clark Seedling berry plants was never stronger, and all growers have been asked to save plants for early setting. Among the most active prospective berry growers are some 10 purchasers of logged off tracts from the Oregon Lumber Co. Pears will be set on the cleared land and berries planted between the rows.

Nickelsen Busy With Fish Committee

J. R. Nickelsen, joint state senator from Hood River and Wasco counties, just back from Portland, where he and his family have been spending the winter, is making preparations for the special legislative session. Mr. Nickelsen, as a member of the Senate fish and game committee, was called to Salem for a conference with Governor Olcott on the Fish and Game Commission squabble, set for Monday.

Senator Nickelsen spent Saturday at The Dalles, where he says considerable difference of sentiment on the Commission-Finley controversy exists. He says he finds local sportsmen fairly harmonious in a desire for a single commission for handling affairs of commercial and game fish interests.

White Home Burglarized
