## ALBERT TOZIER IS GREAT FAIR BOOSTER

In all the state no man has been a greater booster for the Oregon State Fair than Albert Tozier, who spends a great part of his time at Dece on his homestead place. Mr. Tozier is a native of Louisville, Ky. For 23 years he has not missed being in charge of the camp grounds at the state fair. He platted the grounds, laid out the streets, all of which are named most of them bearing the name of some loyal pioneer supporter of the fair. He personally attends to the comfort of the campers and the cleanliness of the grounds, issues bulletins giving the location of every camper on the place and is authority on all subjects, from where the wheelbarrow and axe may be found to all points of pioneer history. Never too tired to do anyone a favor at any hour of the day or night, he frequently forces seeing the exhibits because he is kept busy attending to the numerous demands upon him. He gets his joy out of seeing the happy reunions between old friends and in knowing that the fame of Oregon's products will travel a little farther each year through the thousands who come to camp.

The cottage occupied by Tozier and his sister, Mrs. Edith Tozier Westover, has in it lumber which came from Maine, brought around the horn in 1843. The old wooden eavestrough, over 50 years old, is still serviceable. Two other old buildings on the camp ground are the old headquarters house of Gen. Grant when he was stationed at Vancouver, when pioneers took by ox team to Salem in the early days, and the headquarters of Gen. Sheridan, which was taken from Sheridan to Salem in the same manner.

The state fair board is allowing additional improvements on the camp grounds this year, and hosts of people who have enjoyed camping there in past years and who are outsiders in their appreciation of the capable management and unflinching courtesy of Albert Tozier, will be glad to see him again next fair time.

## SLEEPING SICKNESS CLAIMS W. M. COOPER

News received here last week that W. M. Cooper, of the Upper Valley and a veteran of the forestry service, had passed away in Portland, following an attack of sleeping sickness, brought a general expression of regret.

Mr. Cooper was one of the most enthusiastic promoters of the Lost Lake highway. He was eagerly looking forward to the spring and summer when he could push the work to completion and turn the beautiful forested area around the lake into a public picnic grounds.

Several weeks ago Cooper was detailed to the Oregon national forest office of the service, so that he might be near his wife, who was ill in a Portland hospital. Cooper was a sturdy outdoor type of man and during the period of his work in Portland maintained a cheerfulness and good humor that made his final nervous prostration a surprise to his associates.

While prostrated himself Cooper's wife died more than a week ago, but of this he was not even informed. Cooper developed sleeping sickness and finally pneumonia to which he succumbed last Wednesday night. He is survived by a seven year old son, his parents and four brothers, all of whom reside in the valley.

The body was brought here Friday and taken to Parkdale for interment.

## SUCCESSFUL NIGHT SCHOOL ENDED

A successful winter night school conducted by the high school came to a close last week. Classes were conducted in the following three departments: Book-keeping, typewriting and shorthand and agriculture. The latter course created the greatest interest. R. V. Wright, who had charge of the agricultural night school, says:

"Our classes were very successful. We had an average attendance of 50 adult students at all sessions. We will hold the school again next winter."

Mr. Wright was assisted in his work by Gertrude G. Brown and Leroy Childs, of the extension station, and Prof. L. F. Henderson, Prof. R. V. Gunn, of the O. A. C. faculty, was also here to deliver lectures.

## CLEVELAND MAKES A DEMONSTRATION

With its fan belt removed and its water pump rendered inoperative a Cleveland light six touring car carrying four persons has been successfully driven up Mount Hamilton in northern California, according to a report received by Bennett Brothers, local Cleveland distributors.

The trip up the mountain, on which the link observatory is located, is 150 miles. During the ride the car was not stopped to cool off, nor was it otherwise repaired. The party of four members of the Peacock Motor Sales Co., San Francisco, Cleveland distributors, left Oakland at 8:55 a. m. and reached the link observatory at 12 o'clock. The party stopped for lunch and completed the trip to Oakland at 5:19 in the evening.

Stanley D. Lewin, of San Francisco, acted as observer and at the end of the trip made an affidavit describing the remarkably successful radiation test without fan belt or water pump.

The car was stuck and no adjustments were made beyond the removal of the fan belt and the operation which rendered the water pump useless.
