U. OF O. GLEE CLUB HERE SATURDAY

Something different in the line of musical entertainments will be offered the public Saturday night on the occasion of the visit of the University of Oregon's Men's Glee Club. The club will offer "music everybody likes" all carried off with the snap and verve characteristic of college glee clubs.

This will be the first visit paid Hood River by the University men's glee since before the war. The organization this year is believed to be one of the strongest ever sent on the road. In a preliminary concert given in Roseburg, expectations were realized and the men were received with enthusiasm.

Soloists with the club are Curtis Peterson, baritone; Albert Lukken and George Hopkins, tenors. Mr. Peterson possesses a rare baritone voice, one of the best ever heard at the university. This will be his last year with the glee club, as he is to be graduated with the class of 1920, after which he will go to New York to pursue his vocal study. Both Mr. Lukken and Mr. Hopkins are most pleasing tenors, who possess exceptional individuality of expression.

The club this year made up of 18 members, selected after competition in which the best male voices of the campus participated.

The program this year is made up of three parts. One whole section is devoted to negro melodies. The club made a hit with this part of its program last year. This year's director, Mr. Lukken, has made a specialty of this kind of music. The organization promises something new in the line of stunts, impossible as this may sound. For the rest, the music will be varied, ranging all the way from jazz, of which there will not be too much, to opera, of which there will be enough.

One of the baritone singers with the glee club is Charles Huggins, of Hood River, who also is a member of the quartet.

JOHN GUIGNARD HAS NARROW ESCAPE

John Guignard had a narrow escape last week when caught by a runaway tractor and but for the immediate rescue of a neighbor, Roland Randall who was cultivating with a team, might have lost his life. Mr. Guignard in trying to avoid a stump, allowed his tractor to strike another. His foot caught on a lever, which threw the tractor into high gear and the young man's head was precipitated beneath the shares of a gangplow. With the tractor at high speed, young Guignard was dragged more than 100 feet, the point of the plow lacerating his head. Young Randall was attracted by the high gear chugging of the tractor and dropping the reins sprinted across the ploughed field. Shutting off the power he lifted the heavy plow from his neighbor's head.

Young Guignard says he will invent a foot throttle that will permit a tractor driver to stop his machine more easily when working in rough ground.

Idaho Orchardist Visits Here

L. C. Schubert, orchardist of Payette, Ida., who has been spending the winter in Los Angeles, passed through here last week en route home by automobile. Mr. Schubert declared that he had found no roads worse than those of southern Oregon, where it was necessary to pull cars out of the mud every few miles with teams.

"But," said Mr. Schubert, "crews of men are seen at work all along the route, and that is a hopeful sign." The Payette orchardist spent the winter in the southern California city selling his own apple crop. He says his entire crop will net him \$2.25 per box for all grades.

Fashion Installs Rest Room

The Fashion Stables will probably be one of the first livery stables in the state to be equipped with a ladies' rest room. Men are now engaged in equipping a room at the place with lavatory, with easy chairs and a writing desk. While the livery concern still cares for a few remaining teams, it has discontinued the service of renting horses and buggies. Its automobile buses now operate to various parts of the valley. The concern operates stages on a regular schedule between here and Parkdale and over the Columbia Highway. The new rest room has been added to accommodate women passengers waiting for stages.

Old School May Make Apartment

The local housing situation may be solved to an extent by the sale of the old Park street school. The school board has called for bids on the old building, of eight rooms, to be opened Saturday, April 3. Because of the high cost of building material the old structure, it is expected, will bring several thousand dollars. The old school house may be moved away to be converted into an apartment house.
