Many growers have failed to attribute the illness of the animals to the lead and arsenate poisoning. Indeed, it was thought for a time that the illness was caused from attacks of influneza. Dr. Welch, however, came to the conclusion several months ago that poisoned hay caused the trouble. Because of the great value of the valley's hay crop, however, he hesitated to make public his opinion until it was confirmed by others of his profession.

In the current issue of the American Journal of Veterinary Medicine an article is written by J. W. Kalkus, of Pullman, Wash., who is head of the division of veterinary science at the Washington Agricultural College experiment station, who corroborates the diagnosis made by Dr. Welch. Mr. Kalkus states that the disease a developed greatly during the past three yesrs in commercial orchard districts. Many other horses have died while the disease is at the acute stage. 




