## CITY WINS OVER CHAPMAN AGAIN

Circuit Judge Phelps, of Pendleton, assigned here from Umatilla county to hear the case, has notified City Attorney E. C. Smith of a decision favorable to the defendant city in the case of E. E. Chapman, who was seeking to restrain the city from opening a street over his Columbia lowland property, connecting the Columbia at low water period with city streets. Mr. Chapman contended that the city was trying to turn a portion of a navigable stream into a street, but the city asserted that the property condemned last year as submerged only during the period of high water. The city opened the street both to give passage to vehicles to and from the Underwood, Wash., ferry system during period of low water and to provide a landing place for ferry boats during high water.

W. H. Taft Greets W. H. Taft

One of the interesting incidents of the visit of Judge W. H. Taft to the city Sunday before last was when he was greeted as he left the Hood River High School by W. H. Taft, Hood River's esteemed businessman and Shriner. But for the rush of Judge Taft to catch the train, the conversation would have been more lengthy and interesting. The local W. H. Taft met Judge Taft on a former occasion. The two trace their ancestry back to the same source.

Following the greeting by the local W. H. Taft, Judge Taft shook hands with Chas. Taft, young son of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Taft.

"Charles, I am glad to know you," said the distinguished guest. "I, too, have a son Charles."

Lost Lake Work Progressing

Commissioner Hannum, who was here from the district where he has charge of construction work to attend a session of county court last week reported that work, both by county and forestry crews was progressing on the new Lost Lake highway. Mr. Hannum has seven men engaged in improving a stretch of old road in the Sandy Flat section. The forestry crews are engaged in cutting three miles of new grade through the national forest into the lake. He says the forestry service expects to have the new grade ready for automobile by this fall.

Wagon Travelers Need Camp

"We ought to provide some place for people who travel through in horse drawn wagons to camp," declares W. T. Price. "Because of the litter teams make, we have prohibited wagon travelers from use of our auto park. Yet we have a great many people coming through here in horse-drawn vehicles. I have instructed J. W. Copper, as custodian of the auto park to help traveling by wagon all he can in finding camping places. We may be able to find a place for all of them on a plot of ground east of the city. With the gasoline shortage on, I expect this chain of cross country travel to increase."

Notice of Street Improvement  
Oak Street

Pursuant to the order of the Common Council contained in Ordinance No. 583, of the City of Hood River, passed by the Common Council on the 24th day of May, 1920, and approved by the Mayor on the 28th day of May, 1920, notice is hereby given that the undersigned City Recorder will receive bids for the improvement of Oak street from the west line of Ninth street west to the south line of Cascade avenue, by grading, draining, the construction of cement sidewalks, the construction of cement curbs and gutters and by paving, as follows, to-wit:

A cement sidewalk six (6) feet in width shall be constructed two (2) feet north of the north line of the property abutting the south line of Oak street, from the west line of Tenth street west to the east line of Thirteenth street.

A cement curb and gutter, on both the north side and the south side of said portion of Oak street a distance of twelve (12) feet from the property line, beginning at the west line of Tenth street and extending west to the east line of Thirteenth street.

Paving shall be placed upon the surface of said portion of Oak street for the full width thereof between the curb lines, beginning at the west line of Tenth street and extending west to the east line of Thirteenth street.

Paving shall be placed upon said portion of Oak street sixteen (16) feet in width, being eight (8) feet on either side of the center line of Oak street, beginning at the east line of Thirteenth street and extending west to the south line of Cascade avenue, said work to be done in the manner and form as set forth in the specifications prepared by the city surveyor and now on file in my office.

Sealed proposals for the work will be received at my office up to 8 o'clock p. m. June 21st, 1920, and the Common Council will at its next meeting, after the completion of the publication of this notice, to-wit: On the 21st day of June, 1920, at the council chambers, at the hour of 8 o'clock p. m., proceed to open and consider all bids for said work, which is ordered by the Common Council by said Ordinance No. 583, duly enacted as above specified; that the improvement will be let in one contract, and will be required to be completed within 30 days from the date of the awarding of the same to the successful bidder, who will be required to furnish a bond to the City of Hood River, in a sum of not less than 25 per cent of the estimated cost of the contract for the faithful performance thereof; that complete specifications are on file in my office covering the improvements for which bids are called, which may be examined by prospective bidders upon application or copies thereof will be furnished upon the deposit of \$5.00 to insure the safe return thereof to the City of Hood River after the awarding of the contract, and said contract will be awarded to the lowest and best bidder upon said specifications. The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to waive any defects therein, for the benefit of the City of Hood River. The terms of the specifications shall be notice to prospective bidders of the requirements demanded by said City in the performance of said work.

This notice is given for ten days by publication in the Hood River Glacier, a newspaper published at the City of Hood River, Oregon, the date of the first publication being the 2nd day of June, 1920.

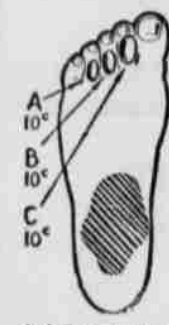
