METHODS OF WAL- NUT TREE PRUNING

(By Gordon G. Brown)

The full severity of winter injury to walnut trees is now apparent. Many trees are dead now or are going to die. There is hope, however, for many trees if they are properly handled.

For clearness, let us divide the walnut trees into two groups; those which are young, possibly up to six or eight years of age, and those which are older. There appears to be little difference in the resistance of trees of either group to this injury. Those which were favorably located or in sheltered positions fared well and are coming on nicely. On the other hand, those which were fully exposed to the icy blasts are now in pretty bad shape. The shelter of a house, barn or windbreak aided the trees materially.

It is evident that a great deal of pruning will have to be done. Preferably this should be done right away. Whether the tree is young or old if it is beginning to throw out a good amount of new growth, even though it be on the older wood, its chances for recovery appear good. In this case I would recommend that all small dead wood be removed at once.

On the other hand there are many trees on which little new growth is appearing. The growth for the last four or five years is dead, or nearly so. A scant feeble growth is appearing here and there. Some limbs are gone entirely. Indeed, in many cases no new growth is appearing on the trunk. Such trees are good as dead. They may eventually make a slight growth, but it will be so weak in character that it is extremely doubtful if it will pay to attempt to nurse such trees along.

Where trees are young and new growth below is starting in good shape, it is better to cut back to the new wood right away.

The limbs or trunks are as yet not large in diameter and with new vigorous growth, such wounds as a result of this pruning should heal over soon enough to insure against heart rot securing an entrance. However, it will be well to paint over the exposed surfaces.

Whether it will pay to try to save some of the older trees is problematical. Where the entire upper tree is dead, obviously the only thing which can be done in the way of pruning is to cut back to a stump. The difficulty from such cutting is the very large wound, which heals over very slowly. Unless one knows that the root system is in very good shape and the tree otherwise very vigorous, it is questionable whether it pays to try to save the tree. It will probably be better to replant.

Where older trees are alive and sound throughout the trunk and a portion of the main branches but the rest of the tree is dead or dying of feeble growth, the writer recommends cutting back severely to sound wood right away. All dead wood should be removed entirely. The toxic effect on the rest of the tree as a result of the presence of a lot of dead wood is well understood.

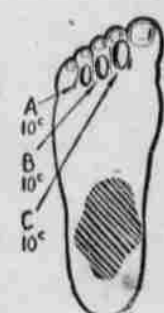
