**WINANS PLANS LOST LAKE HOMESITES**

W. R. Winans, owner of a tract of timber land around Lost Lake, states that he has commissioned E. E. Newell to begin this fall, if weather permits, to plat into a townsite 25 acres on the shores of the lake. The lots, Mr. Winans states, will be 70x70 and will be sold reasonably to local folk for summer homesites. The United States forestry service is laying out larger plots of the national forest, which will be allotted to citizens for summer homes.  
 Mr. Winans, who returned last week with his son, Audron, from a motor trip into the Lake region, says recent rains have brought the water to the highest stage ever seen in the district. Frosts have prevailed on the higher altitude, and he declares the region a riot of autumn colors. He motored to the end of the Lost Lake highway being cut by the forestry service.  
 "The road is in fine shape," he says, "and we only had to walk a mile or quarter. I regret that Lost Lake will be one of Oregon's most popular playgrounds when the lake highway is finished."

**Olin Loses Appeal**

News has been received here that Chas. Olin, Cascade Locks, firm, who appealed a case against Perry Kintzler and the Oregon Fish and Game Commission from the Portland federal court to the court of appeals at San Francisco, lost in the higher court. Olin, who last spring was denied citizenship papers when it was shown that he was a subscriber to a notorious Astoria radical newspaper, sued Kintzler and the fish commission when the commission denied him a license and granted Kintzler a permit to fish over portions of the river he had formerly used. The denial of the commission was based on the Oregon law prohibiting aliens from commercial fishing privileges.

One alley, in the basement of the Monroe building, is already the scene of interesting games. E. E. House and C. J. **HARDING NEEDS REPUBLICAN SENATE**  
**OREGON NEEDS A PROTECTIVE TARIFF**

As is generally known, the present Republican majority in the United States senate is just one vote. Republican control of that body is, therefore in jeopardy. It is the realization of this fact which is causing Oregon's Republicans to unite in support of the candidacy of the Republican nominee for United States senator, Robert N. Stanfield. With a difference of only one in the present senate, Republican voters have awakened to the fact that if they vote for George E. Chamberlain they may by that very act be turning the control of the senate over to the Democrats. On the other hand, by electing Robert N. Stanfield it is possible that his single vote may give the Republicans control of the senate, and thus put that body solidly back of Harding.

Oregon producers are fearful of the effect that the election of Cox and a Democratic senate would have upon them. It is quite evident that under Democratic rule rival products of foreign origin would offer a serious menace to many Oregon products. If the American standard of living is to be maintained, Oregon farmers, livestock men, fruit growers, lumbermen and wool growers must receive a price for their products which will enable them to make a reasonable profit over and above the cost of production. They will be unable to obtain such reasonable profit, or any profit at all, unless a Republican administration is elected to levy protective tariff duties just high enough to save our producers from the ruinous competition threatened by Canadian wheat and lumber, New Zealand butter, Australian wool, Argentine corn and beef, European beet sugar, South American meat and hides and Manchurian Leans and peas. To hamper a Republican president with a Democratic senate flies in the face of a well accepted principle that governmental management should be centralized, so that the people can correctly place the responsibility for success or failure. The feeling among Oregon Republicans is, therefore, becoming quite general that Harding, if elected, is entitled to the support of a Republican senate and that, therefore, Oregon should elect the Republican senatorial nominee, Robert N. Stanfield, to help back up Harding.
