

WINANS PLANS LOST LAKE HOMESITES

W. R. Winans, owner of a tract of timber land around Lost Lake, states that he has commissioned E. E. Newell to begin this fall, if weather permits, to plat into a townsite 25 acres on the shores of the lake. The denial of the commission was based on the Oregon law prohibiting aliens from commercial fishing privileges.
