**TRAFFIC VIOLATOR
ASKS JAIL TERM**

When R. C. Davis, Portland young man, was before Recorder Howe Monday on a charge of turning his automobile between street intersections, he was unable to produce the \$5 fine assessed and instructed Mr. Howe to put him in jail. J. A. Davis, the boy's father, appeared on the scene and soon the mother joined the throng in the city recorder's office. Mr. Howe, however, declined to incarcerate the boy, but stated that he would take the automobile. Three other children were members of the family party, en route to pick apples on the East Side. While Mr. Davis had sufficient funds, he stated he needed the money for buying groceries and the city was instructed to take the car.

"If the town of Hood River can't afford to get along without taking the automobile of people who come here to help harvest the apple crop," declared the head of the family, "then the town is welcome to it. I'll admit that my boy made a mistake. But it is the custom usually to warn people who try to observe general rules before arresting and fining them. The boy has just completed four years in the navy."

The Davis family finally cooled down, however, and when they promised to return after participation in the apple harvest and pay the fine they were permitted to go.

Fines assessed for infraction of traffic laws within the city since September 1 are now nearing 75. Seventeen other fines have been assessed since October 1. The defendants were: W. L. Health Work Progresses in Schools

The modern health crusade work which has been introduced into every school in the county by the county nurse, is meeting with the approval and splendid cooperation of both parents and teachers. The crusaders are children who perform three-fourths of the 11 healthy chores daily.

The aim is to teach good, health habits through the performance of daily healthy chores. As the children succeed they are awarded pins to denote the different degrees, page, squire, knight and knight banneret.

Nutrition is receiving especial attention in the schools this year. Many of the schools are putting in school scales and in every school the children will be weighed and measured monthly and the report will be sent home to parents on monthly report cards, so they can keep in touch with the children's physical as well as their mental development.

Many of the county schools will serve hot lunches during the winter months.

Thomas Marshall Discusses Business

Thomas Marshall, superintendent of the C. & N. W. Company's shops at St. Paul, Minn., is here visiting and looking after a ranch place just west of the city. He says that the trend of business conditions toward normal times of peace-war days is becoming more evident every day. The business of the railroads, he states, has decreased 20 per cent during the first two weeks of October. The rail business is the lightest for the fall period in many years.

"No building is going on," says Mr. Marshall, "and only crops are moving. We now have a good surplus of labor. Business generally is dull, but it shouldn't cause alarm. It is the natural trend of things, resulting from a greater equalization of supply and demand."

Apple Day Planned

Plans are being laid at Seattle for the observance of national apple day, October 30, and the following week as apple week, to encourage Washingtonians to help sell the 15,000,000 boxes of apples produced in the state.

Mayor Caldwell has issued a proclamation calling upon all good citizens to eat apples during the week. The Chamber of Commerce has sent telegrams to commercial bodies throughout the state urging campaigns to encourage apple eating.

The observance of the week will be attended by window exhibits giving suggestions for preparing the fruit for those who do not prefer the apples as they come from the trees.
