BROWN SHOWS THE COST OF NITRATING

Gordon G. Brown, who has just completed the compilation of data on fertilization experiment in the valley for a six-year period ending in 1918, says that the average annual average cost for application of nitrate of soda, which has become extensively used here, has been but \$1.71. His figures show that the average increase in fruit yield of the last three years over the first three years of the test was 60 per cent.

Mr. Gordon's figures show that out of 270 varieties of apples under observation, Newtowns and Spitzenburgs yield the smallest crops. During the first three years of the six-year period Spitzenburgs showed a yield of 200 boxes per acre, and for the last three years 312 boxes. The Newtown yield was 199 boxes for the first three years, 276 boxes the last three years. He expects to show his findings on fertilizer cost and the profits derived from such investments in a bulletin to be published soon.

Apple Deliveries Complete

The delivery of apples by growers to shipping concerns is fairly well complete. The Apple Growers Association, out of an estimated 1,000,000 boxes, harvested by its affiliated growers, has received up to Saturday 850,000 boxes. Other shipping concerns, which handle the balance of the 1,250,000 box crop, have received apples in proportionate quantities. The Association shipped for the week ending Saturday 83,973, an increase of 8,082 boxes for the previous week.
