BROWN SHOWS THE COST OF NITRATING

Gordon G. Brown, who has just com-pleted the compilation of data on fer-tilization experiment in the valley for a six-year period ending in 1918, says that the average annual acreage cost for application of nitrate of soda, which has become extensively used here, has been but \$1.71. His figures show that the average increase in fruit yield of the last three years over the first three years of the test was 46 per cent. Mr. Gordon's figures show that out of 270 varieties of apples under observation, Newtowns and Spitzenburgs yield the smallest crops. During the first three years of the six-year period Spitzenburgs showed a yield of 200 boxes per acre, and for the last three years 312 boxes. The Newtown yield was 199 boxes for the first three years,
