The ormation of the ground makes the co struction work light as only a small fil at the lower end is necessary. Already 12 feet of water, stored from springs, overs an area of three acres. A year or two ago Mr. Williams built a dig his place and up to this year ha only used water from his first project to irrigate the spacious lawn of his ranch, although pipes had been far The addition of th second dam, which is to be connected with the old dam by a pipe line, wil enable the storing of a large amount of water in both dams for irrigation of the orchards on the Williams and Os


