W. C. T. U. CONTRIBUTION IS \$1000.38

Leslie Butler, chairman of the Hood River County W. C. T. U. Home Farm drive, and Mrs. E. E. Lage, drive manager, reported last Thursday that Hood River's total contribution had reached \$1,000.38, exceeding the quota by \$200.38. The county was the first in the state to fill the quota, having raised the \$700 the first day.

Wyeth was the first district to report a full quota, and Pine Grove and Dee were close with second and third place. Mrs. Lage says that she and her associates wish to express public thanks to the many people of the county, who by aiding in the solicitation, their subscription or encouragement made possible the county's enviable record.

HOWARD COOPER PERMANENT ENSIGN

Howard Cooper, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Cooper, is home on a furlough. Mr. Cooper, who enlisted in the navy from the Oregon Agricultural College in 1917, made a steady advancement, and at the time of the armistice had reached the position of reserve ensign. After a period at home he was recently called back to service and is now holding the permanent rank of ensign.

Ensign Cooper is aboard the armored cruiser Misoula, which is scheduled to leave soon for South American waters for an indefinite stay, as first assistant engineer. He may be called to service again before the holidays.

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY CLEARS OVER \$300

The Women's Auxiliary of the American Legion netted more than \$300 from the bazaar held Saturday at the county library. The bazaar, held from the standpoint of articles offered and the sum cleared, was the largest ever held in Hood River county. A single box of extra fancy apples, donated by A. H. Berry, was sold for \$10. The funds raised will go toward an American Legion building. Numerous articles left unsold will be disposed of before the holidays.

Riley Will Again Lecture

The services of Frank Branch Riley, nationally-known lecturer on the scenic and industrial resources of the Pacific northwest, have been obtained for one year with the option of three years by the committee recently appointed by Mayor Baker, of Portland, and consisting of Edward Cookingham, John P. Daly and Dr. Jonah B. Wise. The arrangement is for a minimum of 100 lectures at \$100 a lecture, and his contingent on the completion of a fund now being raised by the committee.

The committee hopes to have the funds for the execution of the first year's contract in time for Mr. Riley to make the advance arrangements for his winter and spring tour, which, if desired, shall begin as early as possible in the new year.

Check for Marriage License Retained

County Clerk Shoemaker has received from the Guaranty Trust & Savings Bank, of Los Angeles, a check drawn recently by Carl Edward Edwards in payment for his license to marry Miss Avel Newton. The note attached was that the drawer of the check had no account at the bank.

Death followed a long illness from heart trouble. Mr. Mohr was an old time resident of Wasco county and was about 55 years old. His widow took the body to The Dalles for burial.
