NEW CITY HALL IS NEARLY READY

Hood River's new city hall, which will house quarters for the Volunteer Fire Department and a comfort station for visiting motorists, as well as a prison for city offenders, will be ready for occupancy soon after the first of the year. The members of the fire department expect to celebrate the opening of the new building by receipt of a new motor driven fire engine. The apparatus has already been ordered at a cost of approximately \$13,000.

The new building, two stories in height, is built of hollow tile. The front is faced with brick. The Baldwin & Swope Construction Co. designed and erected the building.

Mrs. Lemmon is recovering from a recent severe operation.

Funeral services were held at Riverside church at 1 o'clock Sunday afternoon, Rev. W. H. Boddy officiating. Interment followed at Idlewild cemetery. Ritualistic services were observed at the grave by members of the Masonic Lodge.
