FORD BONUS TO EXCEED \$7,000,000

Edsel B. Ford, president of the Ford Motor Co., Detroit, has announced that the regular cash bonus established December 31, 1919, will be continued on the same basis this year. Bonus checks are now being made out and distribution of them will start the first of January. These bonuses are in excess of \$7,000,000 and will be shared by approximately 75,000 men.

In addition, the Ford Motor Co. announces an extra three per cent for the six months ending December 31, on Ford investment certificates. This is in addition to the guaranteed six per cent, (8 per cent having been paid July 13, 1920) making a total of 14 per cent for the year 1920.

Every one in the employ of the company prior to October 1, this year and on the payroll December 31, receives a bonus. The bonus goes to the employee free and clear. However, if he wishes, he may invest his money in Ford Investment certificates, which carry a guaranteed interest of 6 per cent, and also two special payments decided on by the directors of the company.

The bonus affects Ford employees at work in the Ford factory, Detroit; Ford blast furnaces and tractor plant, River Rouge, Mich.; all United States branches, besides the foreign branches at Copenhagen, Denmark; Bordeaux, France; Cadiz, Spain; Buenos Aires, Argentina; Sao Paulo, Brazil; Montevideo, Uruguay, and Cork, Ireland.

No school was held while repairs were being made, but a basket ball tournament was held in the assembly hall. In the final game between the seniors and juniors the former won with a score of 28-14. In the game between the freshmen and sophomores the score was 21-20 in favor of the sophomores.

The junior high school pupils gave a party in the high school auditorium Saturday evening. They had the benefit of the decorations used the night before at the high school party. About 75 pupils and 25 patrons were present. This party was given under supervision of Mrs. Harriet Blaisfield.

The regular assembly was held Monday morning, at which Dorothy Cram and Harry Hays, both students at O. A. C., gave talks. Alberta Carson, who is now attending U. of O., gave a talk. Caroline Howell, who is now teaching at Lyle, was a visitor also.

During the bad weather, for the next month or so, the high school auditorium will be open from 12:25 to 12:50, at noon, under the supervision of the faculty. The students may congregate there to play the piano and sing, or for indoor athletics.

Appropriate exercises will be held in all city school buildings tomorrow afternoon. These will be followed by early dismissal.

School will not be in session next week, and the janitors will take advantage of the opportunity of giving the buildings a thorough cleaning, oiling floors and making necessary repairs.

Mr. Puddy, janitor at junior high for some time, resigned December 21 and was succeeded by J. C. Kennedy.

Work is being rushed to complete the new Park street school this week so that the transfer of desks and other properties can be made during the holidays. It is expected that the pupils will be housed in the new building when they return to school January 3. Most of the old desks will be refinished for use in the new building.

Night school now has 14 members enrolled in commercial subjects. It meets Tuesdays and Thursday from 7 o'clock to 9. A few more students can be accommodated.

The paper drive of last month netted the grade schools \$121.62, three-fourths of which went to the Park street school.
