### BRILLIANT VENUS ATTRACTS ATTENTION

The planet Venus, now the evening star, created a widespread attention here Saturday night. Some peculiar atmospheric condition, probably, caused the great star to appear far larger than usual. Residents of the East Side first noted the brilliance and apparently unusual dimensions of the planet and called friends early in the evening. Before long telephone lines were humming and residents of all sections were taking a look at and commenting on the star.

Venus is the second planet from the sun, and next to the sun and moon the most brilliant object in the heavens. Venus is probably better known as the morning star, known as Lucifer to the ancients, who called the star Hesperus when it shone in the evening.

The brilliancy of the star first attracted the attention of Miles Carter here. Venus's brilliancy attracted Portland folk. According to Prof. Daniels, of Hill Military Academy, the planet is now near the greatest elongation of its orbit and at a point which places it between the earth and the sun. Although Venus approaches nearer the earth than at present, its luminosity now is very marked.

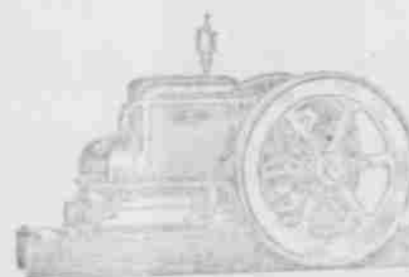
