BUY ELECTRICITY

A new method of rural progress has been launched in the Upper Valley, where an association of orchardists and ranchers have banded together for the wholesale purchase of electric energy from the Pacific Power & Light Co. The concern has arranged with Max L. Moore, local electrician, for the construction of nearly four miles of distributing lines and wiring of residences. The cost of the installation, it is estimated, will reach about \$7,000.
