

RECREATION FOR BOYS IS PLANNED

Hood River, according to plans just announced by Riverside church, will take a lead the coming summer among Northwestern small towns for recreational activity among growing boys. Rev. Boddy, at the meeting of the Commercial club Monday night, stated that the organization, which will invite participation from all boys of the community, whatever may be their religious denomination, had secured C. C. Newhouse as recreational director. Boys from Scout age down to seven years will be included in the activities, which comprehend plans for hikes, camping swimming and neigh-

borhood baseball. The baseball schedule will be so worked out that every boy will be permitted to participate in a match game. Mr. Boddy stated that an anonymous citizen had offered the boys the free use of a 10-acre wooded tract near the city. The youths will be free to develop the property and to build a clubhouse. While an early sale of the place is not anticipated, the owner assures the boys, should such a contingency arise, that he will repay them for their work and investment in a clubhouse. Mr. Boddy says the plans call for a permanent maintenance of the summer recreational organization for boys. The organization will be financed through a fund raised from parents and other interested parties. In order that those who do not wish to give to the

general fund of the community church, may participate in the new work, Mr. Boddy states that a separate recreational fund will be established. In addition to the minister those on the recreational committee are: I. R. Acheson, Truman Butler, R. B. Perigo, A. S. Keir, M. E. McCarty, Mrs. F. A. Cram and Mrs. Geo. I. Slocum.


