BRIDGE COMPANY IS SUING RAIL LINE
 A sequel to a wreck last fall, when a rail auto of the Mt. Hood R. Co. collided with a steam locomotive being used by a crew of the Portland Bridge Co. engaged in building a bridge across the East Fork of Hood River, the bridge company has brought suit against the rail line to collect \$4,200, claimed as the contract price of the bridge, \$486.37, expenses in connection with the contract, and \$29.26, the cost, according to the complaint, of clearing up after the wreck. The complaint alleges that the crew of the construction train was operating under instructions of the rail line. On petition of the rail concern the case has been transferred to the United States district court at Portland. While no answer has been filed here, officials of the rail line declare that the wreck, which resulted in heavy costs to the company in settlement of claims of the rail auto, was the result of damage to equipment, resulted from carelessness of employees of the bridge crew. The case was heard in Portland yesterday.

Correct Report on Wreck
 Traffic Officer Vernon Murray, who Sunday before last found the blood-spattered wreck of a motorcycle sidecar of the Highway near Wyeath last Saturday received a correct report of the accident from O. H. Thompson, a victim of the wreck. The latter writes: "The machine belongs to my brother, Theodore Thompson, 508 E. Pine St., Portland, who with myself was returning from Hood River to Portland when the side car became detached. We were traveling about 30 miles an hour. The accident threw us into a barbed wire fence. I was driving the car and my brother was in the side car. He sustained a broken foot and his hands were badly cut. My face was gashed by the barbed wire from the forehead to the chin. This explains all the blood found on the wreck."

Grange Favors Recall
 Scoring the Public Service Commission the members of Park Grange, who now number 200 and most of them present at the session last week, adopted a resolution favoring the recall of the body because of the award of increased rates for the Pacific Telephone Co. The grangers declare the commission delinquent in its duties to taxpayers and that its members should be replaced at the earliest possible moment by men who will keep in mind the interests of the public while considering requests from corporations.

NEWELL BACK FROM YAKIMA
 E. E. Newell, who has just returned from the Yakima Valley, where he spent several weeks studying irrigation systems, will begin at once supervision of placing the Heights irrigating system of the Farmers' Irrigating Co. in low pressure concrete pipes of 10 inches in diameter. A total of 2,900 feet of pipe will be laid. The cost of the work will reach about \$2,000. Fifty Heights residents use the Farmers' Company's water for irrigation. 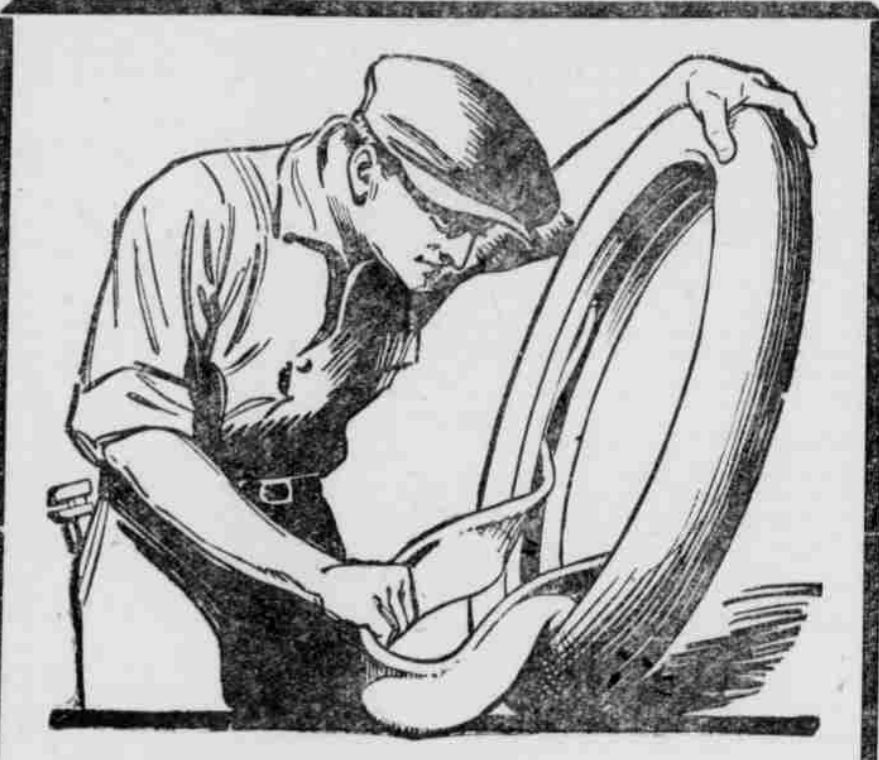
