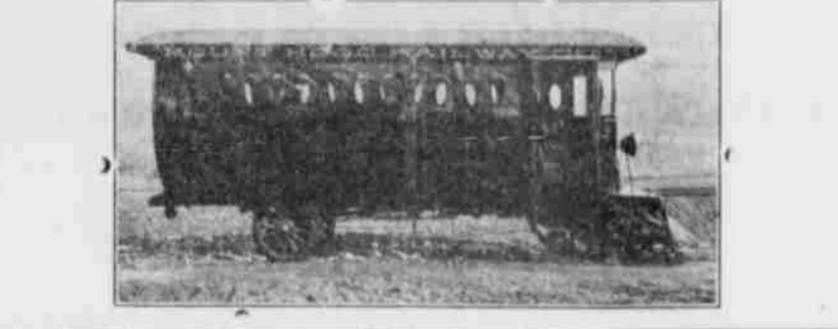

MILWAUKEE MAN PRAISES THE WEST

Geo. W. Young, pioneer of Milwaukee, Wis., who has resided there for 71 years, reiterated the expression so often voiced by easterners on their first journey to the wild and woolly west, as he left here last week after a visit with his old friend and business associate, S. G. Oxborrow, West Side orchardist.

"Your advancement and modes of life are surprising to me," said Mr. Young. "Really, you have a higher type of civilization than can be found in the east. I expected to find men wearing revolvers at their hips and with squaws at their sides. For you people of Oregon and Washington are so far ahead of us that I would be ashamed to compare our roads with yours. Perhaps, though, we haven't the incentive that has impelled you here in the midst of this grand scenery."

Mr. Young, who for 51 years has been chief official of a large life insurance concern, left here for California, where he will visit different points before returning home. Mr. Young will call at Sacramento to visit Wilmer Sieg, former sales manager of the Apple Growers Association, who is his old friend.

GLAD I'M BACK, SAYS GUS MILLER

"The east may boast long and loud over its wealth," says Gus Miller, who has just returned from Ohio, where he spent the winter with his wife attending to matters of business, "but there isn't much to boast over. I intended to remain in Ohio until this fall, but I feared the sultry summer weather would entirely melt me. I was perspiring all day and all night. I lost 20 pounds, and my wife and I decided to pack up and seek the coolness of Hood River Valley. I have already begun to take on that lost flesh."

Mr. Miller says the Ohio districts haven't yet learned how to build roads. The country thoroughfares, he declares, are abominable. Mr. Miller last year purchased a farm from M. R. Noble. The place overlooks the Columbia River Highway at Roubion Hill. He plans on devoting the place and making it one of the valley's beauty spots.

New Cherry Package

A new cherry package called the Signal has been introduced in Oregon and is being used this season for the first time. All of the cherries shipped this year by the Oregon Growers Cooperative Association have been in boxes of this type and reports indicate that they are very satisfactory.

The box has broad slats on the sides, top and bottom so that ample ventilation is provided. The edges of the sides of the box are beveled so that the fruit will not be scratched or bruised and the net weight of the package is about 18 pounds.

The box is a little shorter and deeper than the one which has been used before, the outside dimensions being 17 inches long by 14 inches wide by 9 3/4 inches deep. It makes a very attractive package and there has been a strong demand for cherries packed in this way.

Chimney Sweep Travels In Auto

Jack Percy, professional chimney sweep, here last week with his new set of purchasing an automobile.

"Everybody told me that I needed a truck to haul around my equipment, which I ordered specially from England at the expenditure of a neat fortune," says the chimney sweep. "They told me it would be economy, and that I could make all of the smaller outlying towns at a minimum of expense. That automobile has been the most expensive thing I ever had anything to do with. Owning an automobile is too much of a luxury for a chimney sweep."

Munemato Harvests Tomatoes

The season's first tomatoes were harvested last week by Harry Munemato. The vegetables were retained at the Star Grocery for 25 cents per pound.

The Japanese gardener saved but a small plot of tomatoes from the recent Columbia freeze, which inundated his place. But for this disaster, he would have been harvesting tomatoes in large quantities by this time.
