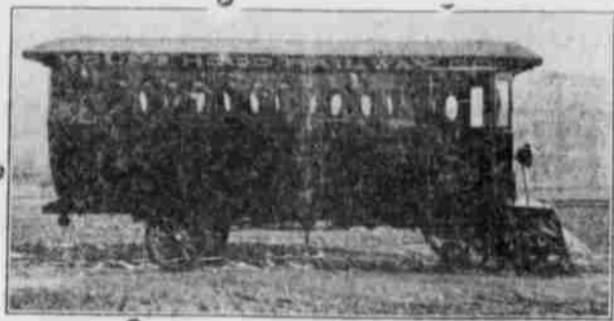

### DR. J. WILLIAMS DIES VERY SUDDENLY

Funeral services for Dr. Josephus Williams, aged 74 and native of Ohio, were held from the family residence in the West Side orchard district, Saturday morning, Rev. Gabriel Sykes, pastor of Astbury Methodist church, officiating. Interment followed at Idlewild cemetery. Members of the Masonic Lodge acted as pallbearers and the Masonic funeral rites were observed. An escort of the Grand Army accompanied the body and observed ritualistic services at the graveside. Dr. Williams, who moved with his family at the age of six to Iowa, died suddenly Wednesday night from a heart attack. His death came as a great shock to his family and friends. Dr. Williams served during the Civil war with Company G, 47th Regiment of Iowa Infantry. After the war he was married to Miss Charlotte M. Conger, who survives. Dr. and Mrs. Williams celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary three years ago. Dr. Williams attended medical schools at Keokuk, Ia., and at Omaha, Neb. He practiced his profession for 27 years in Keosauqua, Neb. He and Mrs. Williams moved here 14 years ago. Mrs. F. C. Brosius is the only surviving daughter of Dr. Williams. The funeral was directed by S. E. Hartness.

### TRUNK ROAD ISSUE FORMALLY APPROVED

County Judge Hasbrouck last week received a report from Teal, Minor & Winfree, Portland attorneys, announcing that approval of the issue of the Hood River county road bond issue of \$550,000, recently voted for joint construction with the state of the valley trunk line of the Mt. Hood Loop Highway. The fund provided will finance a half of the grading and surfacing of the new road with rock and leave a small balance, it is said.
