

In order to avoid a blotchy appearance of the apples due to the thick coating o spray at this late date, our Station i recommending the addition of ? pounds of calsium caseinate to each 100 gal-lons of spray material. This material acts as a spreader and gives the apple a more even and much less noticeable covering of spray. The arsenate of lead should be used at the regular strength of 2 pounds to 100 gallons of

A careful examination of many orhards that have been recently sprayed with Bordeaux and lead shows clearly that growers are not spraying the top: of the trees as they should be doing. Carelessness of this sort will mean many wormy apples which could otherwise have been kept clean by giving the work more careful attention. Growers must take more time in spray ing the tops of the trees than they are now doing if the desired results are to be obtained.


