### APPLE CONVENTION PLANS ARE SHAPING

P. F. Clark, who returned Saturday from Seattle, where he attended a general northwest committee of apple shippers who are arranging for the 1922 convention of the International Apple Shippers' Convention at that place, says that the delegates will be treated to unique entertainment.

"Practically all entertainment features call for out of doors activities," says Mr. Clark, "and the visitors will not be permitted to play inside. Mountaineering, golfing, motoring, indeed, all forms of open air recreation are being provided for the pleasure of the 800 apple buyers expected from all parts of the country."

While Mr. Clark says no arrangements have been made for the return of a special train by way of the Union Pacific lines, delegates being free to return as they choose, he expects that Hood River will have all the visitors it will be possible to care for. Washington districts are making elaborate preparations for entertaining a trainload of the fruit men on their way out.

Just before the convention in late July, Hood River and Mosier fruit growers will perfect an organization to arrange for final details of local entertainment, which will include Columbia River Highway trips, excursions to Mount Hood, fishing and trips to Lost Lake.

### INVITATION SENT BY CLUB TO APPLE MEN

The Commercial club Saturday forwarded 900 letters to members of the International Apple Shippers' Association who will attend annual convention to be held in Seattle in July. The letters, an invitation to the apple buyers to include the mid-Columbia in their itinerary, will go to all parts of the United States. The club epistle urges the fruit men not to miss an opportunity of seeing the Columbia River Highway, declaring a motor spin from Portland to Hood River the most inspiring incident in their trip. The club also can participate in. The letters, signed by President Olmsted and Secretary Crew, are as follows:

"You are now, of course, looking forward to, and planning for your journey to the northwest to attend the International Apple Shippers' Association convention to be held in Seattle July 25-27-28.

"In anticipation of your presence at this gathering, the apple shippers, together with the growers of the Hood River valley, join with our organization in extending to you an urgent invitation to include in your itinerary a visit to the Hood River valley orchards and partake of our hospitality for such time as you may have at your disposal.

"Furthermore, any trip to the northwest which does not include an auto ride over the Columbia River Highway between Hood River and Portland is not only incomplete but omits the most inspiring scenic trip in this entire section. You must not fail to allow us the opportunity of affording you this pleasure."

### BETTER BORDEAUX OIL COMBINATION

R. H. Robinson, agricultural chemist from the State Experiment Station, Corvallis, has been in Hood River the past week working with Mr. Childs on the problem of improving and standardizing methods of preparing the Bordeaux-oil spray.

A number of orchards were visited and many growers were found to be making a faulty Bordeaux, especially where the hydrated lime is being used. A better Bordeaux is found by adding the milk of lime, or the hydrated lime if this is being employed, first. This is a change from the former recommendations which called for the placing of the dilute bluestone solution in the tank. After the lime is added to the tank, the first material to go in, the tank should be filled at least two-thirds full, the bluestone solution should then be added. This should be in a very dilute form, at the rate of one pound to two gallons of water, and added very slowly to the dilute milk of lime already in the tank. During this process the agitator should be run vigorously. The oil should then be slowly added.

A number of growers were found placing the pure oil directly into the tank. This is a serious mistake in that much free oil is found in the prepared spray and which might prove injurious to the trees. This oil should be thoroughly emulsified by pouring an equal amount of water into the oil, stirring well until a white, creamy mass forms.

Growers must remember that the preparation of Bordeaux and the Bordeaux-oil combination is one that requires much care if a good spray is to be formed.

Where growers are not using the oil spray, the delayed dormant, lime sulphur and black leaf spray should be applied in the lower elevations the first of next week. This application is used for the control of peach and brown aphids.

### YAKIMA PETITIONERS GET ENDORSEMENT

A petition of Yakima residents, a motor cortege of whom was recently here, that the State Highway Commission and Morrow county unite in connecting Irrigon with the Columbia river and thus making possible a cutoff route from Yakima by way of the Horse Heaven country, was endorsed by resolution of the Commercial Club Monday night. Copies of the resolution were ordered dispatched to the highway commission and the county court of Morrow county.

G. A. Molden, who is well acquainted with the Horse Heaven region, declares that the cut-off road can be traveled at any time during the winter that the Columbia River Highway will be open. It was declared by Mr. Molden and others that the proposed short lateral road will benefit Portland, Hood River and The Dalles, and numerous speakers declared that Multnomah, Hood River and Wasco counties should assist in financing the proposed road. It was cited that the request of the Yakima good roads boosters should be backed, for it inaugurates a new spirit of cooperation between the highway commissions of the two states.
