



HOWE HAS UNIQUE MOTOR REPAIR SHOP

Hegardt, engineer of the Dock Commission, were here last week studying the ventilated storage quarters of Dan Wuille & Co., London apple merchants, whose northwestern headquarters are located here, and who last season began the direct export of apples from Portland to England in huge quantities.

The Portland Dock Commission recently announced that it would provide equipment for an approximate 300,000 boxes of apples on the wharves. A visit of the two chief officers to the local plant indicates that they anticipate installation of ventilated storage facilities similar to those found efficient by the London shippers.


