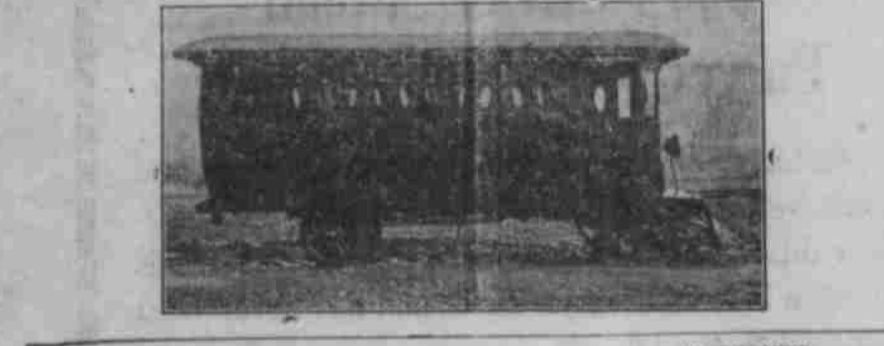

**COMMON USER OF NATION PASS ENDORSED**

A resolution was adopted by the Commercial Club members Thursday endorsing the plan of the Central Oregon Development League for a common user of the Natron cut-off by the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific lines. The local citizens were addressed at a luncheon by Mayor W. H. Doolittle and J. W. McCulloch, of Ontario.

"We are making a tour of the state," said Mr. McCulloch, "in order to educate the people to the needs of the common user as a whole. Unless a railroad is built from Ontario to Eugene, as originally planned by the late E. H. Harriman, when he controlled the three great Pacific systems, we will never see a development of that great landed area of central and south-eastern Oregon. We are told that the Central Pacific may tap us from Ogden. This is improbable, if possible, and even should such development occur, it will result in deflecting our trade to California. We want this development and the drawing of new settlers, in order that we may create new wealth and a readjustment of the tax burden."

The resolution adopted by the local citizens follows:

"Whereas, The Supreme Court of the United States, by recent decision in the case of the United States versus the Southern Pacific and Central Pacific railway companies, has declared the operation of the two systems under one management as inimical to the general welfare of the country and has ordered that the Southern Pacific Company be divested of the Central Pacific properties, and

"Whereas, Our attention as citizens of Hood River county and members of the Hood River County Commercial Club has been called by the Central Oregon Development League to the needs of railroad development in that great area in the southeastern and central part of our state, and

"Whereas, We believe that one of the greatest needs of Oregon is the settlement of this landed empire, which will automatically result in a relief from our existing burden of heavy taxes.

"Now, Therefore, be it Resolved, That we endorse plans for the final disposition of the properties of the Central Pacific Company which call for a common user of the Natron cut-off by the Southern Pacific and Union Pacific systems, our action in this matter being actuated by the belief that such solution will result in the constructing of a rail line from Ontario, Oregon, to Eugene, Oregon, with various laterals, and that such construction alone will develop this hinterland of ours and tend to weld our state into a greater commercial unit and body politic, and be it further Resolved, That we forward copies of these resolutions to our congressional delegation, the Central Oregon Development League and the press of the state."

**Mr. Irwin Explains Action**

I didn't think of explaining myself to these tourists. I guess they thought I was nutty."

Dr. Mathews, pastor of the First Christian church at Seattle, whose utterances were broadcasted from the Sound city.

**NEW LOST LAKE GRADE IS OPENED**

A mile of new grade of the Lost Lake Highway, just outside the borders of the Oregon National Forest, was opened to the public Friday, according to W. A. Langille, superintendent of the work, here last week on business. The new road, on a maximum grade of five per cent, eliminates stretches of the old road which reached 15 per cent.

Mr. Langille is moving his 25 men to the lakeshore, where he will begin construction of a main extension of the highway around the east side of the lake. While motor traffic to the recreation center is heavy this year, it has not reached the maximum influx of last year, stimulated to an unusual degree by the heavy crop of blackberries there. Huckleberry picking will soon be a magnet for hundreds of vacationists, however, Mr. Langille says.

The Hood River Spray Co. will begin construction at once on a 34 by 100 feet warehouse. The basement of the structure, served by a track of the O. W. & N. Co., will be frost proof and will be utilized by the C. M. Kopp Co., apple shippers of Yakima, who have established a permanent branch here.
