## REPUBLICANS WILL ADOPT A PLATFORM

The Republican state central committee, under instructions from legislative and senatorial candidates, senatorial hold-overs state committeemen and other leading Republicans from every county in Oregon, has called a meeting of Republicans to be held in Portland September 26 for the purpose of adopting a set of principles telling the voters for what the party stands in the coming campaign.

Delegates to the meeting will consist of all Republican legislative and senatorial candidates, and hold-over senators, state and congressional committeemen, all Republican county chairmen and vice chairmen, and all Republican county officers and Republican candidates for county office.

A committee was appointed at a meeting held in Eugene Saturday, September 9, to draft a set of resolutions for submission to the convention. Senator Bruce Dennis, of La Grande, was made chairman of the committee and any Republican having any suggestions of "planks" to offer, is invited to send the same to Mr. Dennis, but all such planks must be submitted before noon of September 25.

Headquarters for the convention will be at the Imperial Hotel and the place for holding the meeting will be announced through the press.

This convention is the result of a trip through the state of the officers of the new Republican state central committee, Chairman Toose and Secretary C. E. Ingalls. They have visited every county in the state and organized the county committees. At a meeting held in Pendleton of eastern Oregon Republicans it was decided to hold a state wide meeting for the purpose of adopting a platform for the party. The plan was with the approval of the Republicans of the First and Third congressional districts. This meeting was held at Eugene September 9 and the plan was unanimously approved.

"I think it is very important," said Chairman Toose, "for the Republican party to have a platform upon which its state candidates should run. This will enable the Republicans of the state to know what they are voting for, and will fix definitely the responsibility of the fulfilling of all promises made to the people. As it is now, there are 76 different platforms by as many different candidates and hence no organized responsibility. This in a large measure has been the cause of many unnecessary tax measures. We propose to hold the party responsible for legislation and we believe we will thereby get better legislation."

The Eugene meeting was an enthusiastic one and from every county pledging support to Governor Olcott in his campaign for reelection. The governor was present and made an address at the evening banquet which was well spoken of by the delegates present. He said he proposes to submit to the legislature a definite and constructive plan for tax reduction and tax equalization and the plan will be the result of the exhaustive labors of the tax investigation committee which he appointed last winter.

### North Bank Work Costly

According to Senator Crawford, of Gandallles, here last week, the contract for the North Bank Highway between Underwood and Lyle will be let the first of October. He estimated that this piece of road, in the neighborhood of eight miles in length, will cost more than half a million dollars. Survey of the road between Underwood and Hood in Skamania county has been ordered. Powder for the work will be furnished by the county, while the work on the road is to be done by the state, navy officials, and residents of Underwood and Hood.

Much improvement is planned in Skamania county, one of the proposed projects being the purchase of six acres of ground at the Cedars at Willards on the Little White Salmon river, long a favorite spot with fishermen and hunters.

The Cooke grade is now finished. The big team shovel which has been at work on this grade completed its operations last week and the road has been opened for traffic. The grade which is about three miles in length has been widened to 27 feet, and an average of a seven per cent grade established.

Skamania county and the state have just awarded a contract for a new road from the highway to Lava creek. The road will be 12 feet wide and well graded.

### A County Dental Clinic

The report from Miss Campbell, our efficient county health nurse, will enable all those who read it, to appreciate the importance of a dental clinic for our county. These are moves in the right direction. These clinics are not, however, to care for the teeth of children whose parents are fully able to meet the cost of dental work, but only for children who otherwise would have to go without the care so much needed for their teeth.

We have no doubt that the whole community will back up such a work, doing all that is needed to bring to it all the success it deserves so richly.

### Man Drowns at Cascades

Visitors from Cascade Locks have brought news of the drowning in the mill pond of the Denovan-Dubois Lambert Co. at Cascade, Wash., just across the Columbia in Skamania county, of Joe Williams. He was missed at noon and his hat was found floating on the pond. The body was found by grapplers three hours later in 10 feet of water. Williams, who is survived by his wife had resided at Cascades about 10 years.

### Upper Valley Harvest On

The Apple Growers Association last week began to pack out the Upper Valley Gravenstein crop. The fruit is being sized and packed at the Association warehouse. Elmer Lyle is in charge of the warehouse. Frank Smith has been appointed inspector for the Parkdale district.

## IMPORTANCE OF THE DENTAL CLINIC

The following bulletin issued by the Red Cross and Public Health bureau shows the importance of dental clinics for children:

At a meeting of the Red Cross board of directors held at the Oregon Hotel Wednesday noon, September 6, it was voted that equipment for a dental clinic be installed in the public health nurse's office, in the basement of the public library at Hood River. The local dentists have shown a splendid public spirit by consenting to devote one day a month, free of charge, to caring for the children's teeth.

Everyone today is concerned in the health of his teeth and mouth. Formerly diseases of the mouth were considered to be only of passing interest for it was thought that, although they produced temporary pain and discomfort, at the worst, they could only result in the loss of teeth. But more recently we have come to recognize a distinct relationship between the common dental diseases and the general health of the individual. It has been shown that a diseased mouth may mean a diseased body and that serious systemic derangements may arise from a diseased mouth and about the teeth.

Since September 5, 100 Hood River county school children were examined for dental defects, and only 10 of the 100 children were found to have teeth in good condition. The others were found to have pus exuding from the gums, deciduous teeth blocking the entrance of permanent teeth, atrophied teeth due to nutritional disturbances during infancy or early childhood, absence of or decayed six-year molars.

It is found in the majority of cases that if children be kept in perfect physical condition they are mentally alert. A child who has physical defects including defective teeth is liable to repeat his grade perhaps several times at a great cost to the community. As we know, in Oregon it costs almost \$100 a year to educate each child. It costs the taxpayer two and three times this amount to put a child who is physically unfit through school, and in the end what is very often the result of this expenditure? A citizen who cannot take care of himself or his family as they should be cared for and very often in a court charge, add to this the physical and mental sufferings of those people and you have the price paid for neglect during childhood.

It was found in an examination of the children's teeth at the Northwest high school, Detroit, Mich., that those with good teeth have two and one half times as many high marks as those with very bad teeth and only one third as many failures. For every two children with good teeth, who have to repeat a subject, seven with bad teeth have to do so.

## VALLEY TRUNK GRADE NEARING COMPLETION

Unless weather conditions interfere the entire grade of the Mount Hood Loop Highway in Hood River county will be completed late this fall, according to Resident State Highway Engineer Seelye, here last week from Parkdale.

E. A. Webster, who has the unit of grading between Odell and the Columbia River Highway intersection, is now working two shifts, a total of 135 men, on a heavy fill at Whiskey creek. This section of the road, except some short stretches in the Van Horn vicinity, where construction was postponed until next spring in order not to block apple hauling, will probably be completed in the next few weeks.

John & Eddon, contractors on the Booth Hill unit, whose work has been delayed because of activities of I. W. W., are expected to complete this section before December 1. They still have about 2,000 feet of heavy excavation.

The Johnson Contract Co., building the 12-mile grade from Booth Hill to the boundary of the Oregon National Forest, still have about 8,000 feet of grading left. The right of way has been slashed entirely through to the national forest.

### Legion Offers Essay Prizes

Essays on "How the American Legion Can Best Serve the Nation" are arriving at state headquarters in Portland. School children in Oregon will have until October 6 to present their essays, extension being granted in order to give students an opportunity of consulting with their teachers. Prizes as follows, will be given winners: National, \$750, first; second, \$500; third, \$250; to be used for scholarships.

The essay must not be over 500 words in length. Any boy or girl between the ages of 12 and 18 may compete. All essays must be in the hands of the state adjutant of the American Legion in Portland not later than October 6. Selection will be made by Legion judges of the three best essays and these will be forwarded and entered in the national contest. National winners will be announced during November.

### Charivari Sad Affair

Vandalism of a party engaged in a charivari last week at the home of a newly wed Belmont couple, Mr. and Mrs. Ed Nordier, may result in criminal complaints. The serenaders did not stop with the usual greetings of noises but ascended the roof, tore off shingles, stopped chimneys with burlap bags filled with sand. They also raided an orchard adjoining the Nordier home, removing props and causing the destruction of numerous trees.

Officers state that the ringleaders of the charivari party were identified.

### Valley May Have New Hotel

According to information received by local folk from friends in Sacramento, Calif., Hood River has been tentatively included in a list of Pacific Coast points to receive one of the series of large motor tourist hotels being planned. The company, composed of a number of wealthy Californians, is said to have already subscribed \$2,000,000.

The new hostilities will be called "rodomes."
