C. E. COOVERT'S FATHER PASSES AT DAYTON

The following obituary notice of the father of C. E. Covert is taken from the Dayton Tribune:

James W. Covert was born in Peble county, Ohio, June 16, 1847, and died at his home in Dayton, Oregon, November 27, 1922, being 75 years, 5 months and 11 days old.
He was united in marriage to Miss Susan Frankenberg in Newton county, Indiana, November 26, 1868, and to this union four sons were born: Chas. E. (Patt), William E. (Eddie), Richard E. and James E. Covert, who survive him. His wife died December 5, 1906. On October 16, 1908, he was married to Mrs. Mary M. Howard, who with her three daughters, Grace, Mabel and Vida, also survive him.

He enlisted as a private in the Civil war at Newton, Indiana, February 24, 1865, for one year or during the war, and was mustered out at Nashville, Tenn., September 19, 1865.
He became a member of the G. A. R. in Nebraska and when Upton Post, G. A. R., was organized in Dayton he was a charter member and had held nearly every office in the Post.

He first came to this part of Oregon from Indiana in the fall of 1871. After seven years' residence in Oregon he moved to Dawson county, Nebraska, and lived there until the summer of 1890 when he returned to Dayton and vicinity and had lived here continuously till the time of his death.
He had been a member of church from childhood and was a member of the Evangelical church since its organization in this part of Oregon, to the time of his death, and did much for the work of the church. He held office in this church continuously until failing health caused him to resign about one year ago. His sickness was of two or more years' duration and during all his suffering he was a patient sufferer.

Besides his family he leaves a host of sorrowing friends. Funeral services were held in the Evangelical church here, Tuesday, November 28, 1922, Rev. F. E. Fisher officiating. Interment was in the I. O. O. F. cemetery. Ritualistic services at the G. A. R. were conducted at the grave by members of Upton Post.

SGOBEL & DAY WILL SHIP 350 CARS

White Salmon and Underwood apple districts suffered no loss from the low temperatures of last week, according to Paul McKercher, of White Salmon, who with J. Arthur Riggs, of this city, represents Sgobel & Day in the mid-Columbia. The activity of growers' organizations and shipping concerns in both places in constructing adequate storage the past year, enabled them to handle their apples safely. Mr. McKercher says that shipments for his firm in the Washington districts are well cleaned up.

The company last week still lacked nine cars on an order of 45 carloads of export Newtowns, which will be shipped to New York City, whence they will go to Denmark, Norway, Sweden and South America.
"We still have a total of about 70 cars to roll from Hood River," said Mr. McKercher. "Our total shipments from the mid-Columbia, eastern Oregon and the Willamette Valley will reach 350 cars."

ENGLISH APPLE MARKET IS GOOD

Dan Wuille & Co. last week received a message from London to the effect that Newtown apples were selling at 16 shillings the box. At the rate of exchange at present prevailing this will net growers an approximate \$1.75 per box.
Shippers say the steady trend of the export market is a bright feature for local growers, a large portion of whose tonnage is Newtowns, considered the staple export apple.
