

The net water head is 187 feet. The fire proof powerhouse is 47 by 82 feet and 17 feet high. The big surge tank is 207 feet high. The flow line is 15,985 feet long, made up of the following construction: Woodstave pipe, 10 feet in diameter, 7,851 feet; 10-foot steel pipe, 604 feet; steel pipe, of a diameter 8 feet and 4 inches, 1,409 feet; wood stave pipe, 8 feet in diameter, 120 feet; wood stave pipe, 8 feet in diameter, 120 feet; concrete lined ditch, 520 feet.

The pipeline has a capacity of 500 cubic feet per second. It is supported by 1,300 concrete saddles. The series of settling basins, which will remove glacial silt from the water, are 142 feet long by 48 feet wide. They can be flushed separately without interference with the flow of the pipe. One

of the unique roller gates is 75 feet long and 7 feet and 8 inches in diameter. The gates can be so operated as to divert into the intake so much of the flow of the stream as needed for
