THE DALLES CHAMBER AID'S FRUIT MEN

One of the most interesting phases of the pollination work that is being carried on in the vicinity of The Dalles, is that of the hearty cooperation of the merchants of that city through their Chamber of Commerce in fostering this project and the leading of their assistance to the growers and farmers in the many problems that they face. The expense involved in carrying on the pollination work was handled almost entirely by this organization. Too often there is a lack of cooperation between city and rural interests and The Dalles Chamber of Commerce is certainly to be congratulated in the way that they are assisting the farmers and fruit growers of their district. Their endeavors will certainly bring big returns not only to the city of The Dalles, but the farmers and fruit growers as well.

Safety Campaign Planned
Commencing June 1, the Safety Section of the American Railway Association is staging an educational campaign for the prevention of railroad grade crossing accidents. The campaign will continue with vigor for four months. It is hoped that accidents at railroad crossings will not only be reduced to a minimum during these four months, but that the results afterward will reflect the benefits of the campaign.

In the United States in the past five years, 9,101 persons have been killed and 24,208 seriously injured on account of collisions between vehicles and trains, cars, or engines at crossings. Millions of lithographed posters are being distributed throughout the country by the railroads which are members of the association. They picture graphically the terror of the occupants of an automobile about to be struck by a fast moving engine. A large number of these posters are being distributed in the vicinity of the work. As the campaign progresses, monthly results will be compiled showing casualties during the period of the campaign against the same period in 1921 and 1922.

Canned Fruit for Charity
The Pacific Coast Rescue and Protective Society requests its friends to remember the girls of the Louise Home and the babies of the Albertina Kerr Nursery Home when canning fruit and vegetables this year. The Louise Home and Albertina Kerr Nursery cared for last year respectively, 144 unfortunate girls and 182 homeless babies and youngsters. The babies and girls were committed from 28 counties of the state. Gold Fever in Upper Valley
Gilbert Edgington, operator of a mountain pack trail, brought news here last week of considerable excitement in the Upper Valley over the discovery of gold on the northeast side of Mount Hood. William Moody, pioneer homesteader of the district, and his two sons, Mr. Edgington said, who began prospecting as soon as snow would permit, had found gold traces. Moody's discovery, he declared, would probably lead to a general fever of prospecting on the part of numerous Upper Valley men this summer. The elder Moody for years has claimed that gold exists at a certain location on the mountain side.
