**MARION NEIGHBORS**  
EX-TOL PRESIDENT

Dr. and Mrs. H. L. Dumble and Mr. and Mrs. W. H. McClain joined Friday in sending a telegram of condolence to Mrs. Warren G. Harding. It was a message carrying sympathy of old neighbors and expressive of their sincere grief at the passing of a friend. Mrs. Dumble and President and Mrs. Harding grew from youthful days to manhood and womanhood in Marion, O. Mr. McClain for 12 years was a fellow tenant of the President in the same building in the Ohio city. Both local couples visited President and Mrs. Harding recently when they were in Portland.

"The nation can ill afford to lose a man the type of President Harding," declared Mrs. Dumble Friday. "He was a self-made man, a man of the highest type of clean American citizenship. No one respected or admired him more than his close neighbors of the Ohio community."

The telegram of the local folk, sent to Geo. B. Christian, the president's private secretary, was as follows: "Express to Mrs. Harding our deepest sympathy in her great sorrow which is shared by a grief-stricken nation that loved and was loved by Mr. Harding. We will cherish through the years the recollection of his warm handclasp and sincere words of greeting extended his Marion friends on the occasion of his recent visit amongst us."

Discussing President Harding Friday, Mr. McClain said: "It is difficult to express the feelings of those who know Mr. Harding through the years of his earlier efforts to serve his community, his state and his country."

"Warren G. Harding was unwavering in his loyalty to his friends and to principles he believed right, yet he was generous and gentle in his consideration of others whose opinions were at variance with his own. He had the respect and absolute confidence of every man, woman and child who came in contact with his magnetic personality."

"On the occasion of his recent visit to Portland, where he informally greeted many of his old neighbors, any thought that his great humanity, his innate love for the simple virtues had been spoiled by his elevation to the highest office in the world, was quickly dispelled by his warm hand-shake and the genuine pleasure he showed in his face and speech."

"No one but a 'Marionette' can realize the grief of this once proud little Ohio city, that has nurtured and encouraged her illustrious son up the heights to the very pinnacle of honors. And he loved that town and its citizens no less than they loved him. Former residents who have strayed far over the face of the globe join in deepest sympathy for Marion in her irreparable loss."

**AUTOMOBILE FOLK**  
COMPLY WITH LAW

Motor truck and passenger car operators have had the opportunity during the past three weeks to secure full information concerning the provisions under the automotive transportation act of 1921, special session of the state legislature.

Representatives from the state department, traffic division and the Public Service Commission of Oregon, were at the office of Sheriff Johnson and carefully explained the rules which have been established under the law now on the statute books of Oregon.

The state representatives express their appreciation of the manner in which the operators and citizens of Hood River treated them and the courtesies shown them during their stay here.

The misunderstandings which have existed since the law was passed in the latter part of 1921 seem to be pretty generally cleared away and there is no longer any doubt that any other operators subject to the law who have not applied for their certificates, will do this with the least practicable delay.
